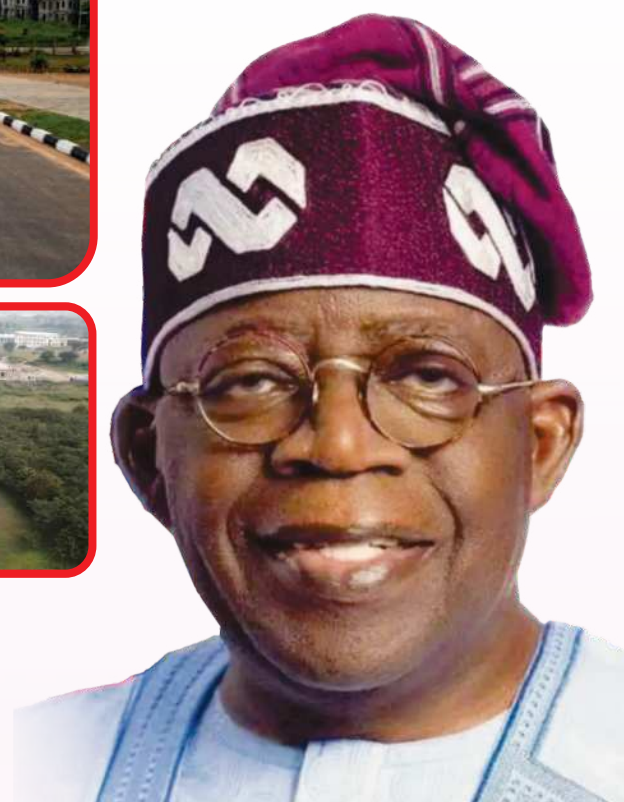

## WHY BOTTOM-UP POLICY IS DELIVERING BETTER RESULTS IN FCT

One of the greatest challenges of public policy in developing countries is not necessarily the shortage of resources but the disconnect between government decisions and the actual needs of the people. For many years, development planning in Nigeria largely followed a top-down approach in which government officials designed projects from their offices and expected communities to accept and utilise them.

While this model produced some successes, it also resulted in numerous projects that failed to achieve their intended objectives because the beneficiaries were not sufficiently involved in determining what they actually needed.

The Federal Capital Territory (FCT) is increasingly demonstrating that there is a better alternative. Under the leadership of the Minister of the FCT, a noticeable shift has occurred towards participatory governance, particularly in rural infrastructure planning. Communities are increasingly consulted and encouraged to identify their priority needs and recommend the most appropriate locations for projects before implementation begins. This simple but transformative approach is gradually redefining the relationship between government and citizens.

From the perspective of public administration and policy analysis, this represents the practical application of bottom-up policy formulation, a model that recognises local communities as partners rather than passive recipients of government programmes.

Instead of assuming that policymakers possess all the answers, the approach acknowledges that those who live with developmental challenges every day are often best positioned to identify practical and sustainable solutions.

This philosophy is strongly supported by the Advocacy Coalition Framework developed by Paul Sabatier, which emphasises collaboration among stakeholders in shaping public policy.

It is equally reinforced by Bottom-Up Implementation Theory, championed by Richard Elmore and the work of Michael Lipsky on street-level bureaucracy, which argues that successful public policies emerge when those closest to implementation and the intended beneficiaries actively influence policy decisions.

The approach also reflects the principles of Participatory Governance Theory, which advocates shared decision-making between government and citizens.

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These theories stand in sharp contrast to the traditional Top-Down Policy Model, associated with scholars such as Daniel Mazmanian and Paul Sabatier in their earlier implementation work, where policy objectives are formulated centrally with limited consultation. While top-down policymaking can be effective for national emergencies and highly technical issues, it often struggles when local realities differ significantly from assumptions made by decision-makers.

The history of development planning in the FCT provides valuable lessons on the limitations of policies designed without sustained engagement with intended beneficiaries. One notable example is the Jibi Resettlement Scheme.

The scheme was conceived to relocate communities affected by the development of Phase II of the Federal Capital City. Construction commenced in 1999 and was substantially completed by 2002 in preparation for the movement of thousands of households. However, before the relocation could take place, the estate was allocated to the Nigeria Police Force, thereby altering the original resettlement plan.

The episode illustrates how major policy decisions that do not fully align with the expectations of intended beneficiaries can significantly affect implementation outcomes and delay the achievement of policy objectives.

The Jibi experience offers an enduring lesson for policymakers. Development initiatives are most sustainable when they are built around the expectations, participation and confidence of the people for whom they are intended. Policies conceived without meaningful community engagement often encounter resistance, require costly adjustments or fail to achieve their original purpose.

The FCT administration has adopted a markedly different approach. Across the Area Councils, communities have been encouraged to identify and prioritise the roads and infrastructure that matter most to their social and economic well-being. Rather than imposing projects from the centre, government officials

have listened to rural dwellers, whose firsthand knowledge of their communities has guided project selection. The result is the construction and rehabilitation of numerous rural access roads that directly reflect the priorities identified by the people themselves, thereby improving mobility, agricultural productivity, access to markets, healthcare and education.

A remarkable demonstration of this participatory governance model occurred during one of the minister's inspection tours. While interacting with residents, community members passionately appealed for the construction of the Kagini-Kabba and the Zaudna roads, explaining the hardships they had endured over the years. After listening to their concerns firsthand, the minister gave an on-the-spot approval, on behalf of the president, for the commencement of both projects. The decision reflected a leadership style that values direct engagement with citizens and underscores the importance of allowing community needs to shape government priorities.

This is policy formulation at its most practical. Instead of waiting for recommendations to pass through several bureaucratic layers before action is taken, government listened to the people, assessed the evidence on the ground and responded to clearly articulated community priorities. The roads were not merely government projects; they were conceived from the aspirations of the communities themselves.

This approach embodies the principle that those who experience development challenges daily should help shape the policies designed to address them. It also aligns with the contemporary concept of co-production in public service delivery, where government and citizens jointly create public value through collaboration.

The benefits are already becoming evident. Community participation strengthens ownership, reduces resistance during implementation, improves accountability, minimises waste and ensures that scarce public resources are invested where they deliver the greatest impact. Because communities participate in identifying their priorities, completed projects are embraced, protected and utilised by the beneficiaries.

As a student of public administration and policy analysis, I consider this evolution in governance one of the most significant policy innovations currently taking place in the FCT. It

■ The Kaduna State Police Command has arrested six suspects over the mob killing of two travellers who were wrongly accused of being kidnappers and motorcycle thieves at Gidan Kalu village in Birnin Yero, a few kilometres from Maraban Jos. The command said the incident occurred on July 1 when Muhammadu Sani, 45, and his friend, Aliyu Mohammed, 40, both from Umar village in Igabi Local Government Area, were travelling on a motorcycle to Tudun Wada, Zaria, to visit a sick relative. 6

■ The Operation HADIN KAI has recorded another significant breakthrough in the ongoing counter-terrorism campaign following the surrender of two senior commanders to troops of Sector 2 in Geidam. The surrendered terrorists, identified as Munzirs within the terrorist leadership structure, arrived Maiduguri on 5 Jun 26 and are currently in military custody undergoing detailed profiling, debriefing and intelligence exploitation. Preliminary interrogation indicates that the two surrendered commanders occupied influential positions and possess extensive knowledge of the group's operational activities, command arrangements and logistics architecture. 10

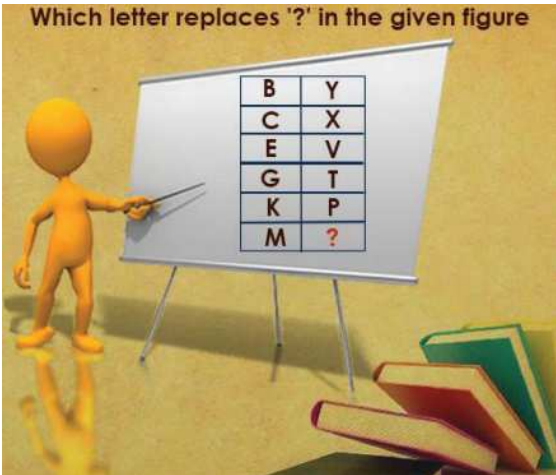
■ Staff of the Zamfara State Publishing Company, publishers of The Legacy and Suda newspapers, Tuesday, raised the alarm over what they described as the secretive auction of the company's entire printing equipment. They said the move has grounded operations and thrown the fate of more than 150 workers into uncertainty. The workers, who spoke to Blueprint on condition of anonymity, alleged that the management sold off the equipment without following due process. 14

■ The president of the Kagoro Secondary School Old Boys Association (KASSOBA), Dr. Mark Anthony, has reiterated the association's commitment to investing in innovations that will uplift the success of students of Government College, Kagoro. Dr. Anthony made this known during the school's 2026 Annual Speech and Prize Giving Day held Tuesday. ## Business News

■ The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN)'s Balance of Payments (BoP) show that Nigeria recorded a current account (CA) surplus of \$5.0 billion in the first quarter of 2026, significantly higher than \$1.4 billion in the fourth quarter of 2025 and \$3.4bn in the first quarter of 2025. The improved surplus on the CA was primarily driven by a sharp increase in the trade surplus, which advanced to \$6.0 billion from \$1.8 billion in the prior quarter. The stronger trade balance reflected an improvement in export earnings alongside a moderation in import demand. **19**

■ Transactions on the floor of Nigerian Exchange sustained a growth profile appreciating by N1.864 trillion as gains in highly capitalised stocks lifted trading activities. Market capitalisation of listed equities appreciated by 1.24 per cent to N152.135 trillion from N150.271 trillion recorded the previous day. The NGX All Share Index also increased by 2905.05 basis points to 237083.28 points from 234178.23 points traded on Monday. **19**

■ The Nigerian Electricity Regulatory Commission (NERC) on Monday, held a regional seminar for judges of the Lagos State High Court in Lagos, aimed at strengthening judicial understanding of the evolving Nigerian Electricity Supply Industry (NESI). In his opening address, the Chairman of NERC, Dr. Musiliu Oseni, said NERC has transferred electricity market oversight to 16 states, ushering in a new era of multi-level regulation. **20**

■ In a significant boost to infrastructure and development initiatives, the Minister of the Federal Ministry of Innovation, Science and Technology (FMIST), Kingsley Tochukwu Udeh SAN, has reaffirmed the Federal Government's commitment to technology commercialisation, local content development, industrial competitiveness, and sustainable job creation. The minister stated this during a visit to the site of the proposed Project NOVA Hub at the headquarters of the National Office for Technology Acquisition and Promotion (NOTAP). **20**

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## US-IRAN WAR: BLOODSHED, DIALOGUE, AND ACCENTUATED LESSONS (2)

Like several wars, the US-Iran war has been an ill wind that has forced multinationals to count their losses, and it will take years to rebuild what has been destroyed. At the same time, we continue to mourn the deaths of several innocent victims: children, women, and the elderly. This tragedy reinforces a central lesson: war brings destruction, but dialogue remains the only path to lasting peace.

In my earlier article, I cited the African proverb, 'when two elephants fight, it is the grass that suffers'. Although it is old, the proverb remains relevant because it captures a reality unchanged by today's technological advances and military campaigns. Political leaders may declare war; military commanders may plan its operations; while defence industries may profit from arms sales, but the heaviest burden invariably falls on ordinary citizens who neither declared the conflict nor controlled its outcome. This reality has been witnessed repeatedly across Africa. Since April 2023, Sudan has been engulfed in a devastating conflict between General Abdel Fattah al-Burhan's Sudanese Armed Forces and the Rapid Support Forces led by Mohamed Hamdan Dagalo, widely known as Hemedti. Millions have been displaced, hundreds of cities have been damaged, and economic activity has collapsed across large areas of the country. Yet despite the suffering, all meaningful efforts towards resolution continue to revolve around negotiations, mediation, and political dialogue. Similarly, in the Democratic Republic of Congo, decades of conflict involving government forces, rebel movements, and external interests have produced one of the world's most persistent humanitarian crises, with violence consuming countless lives. These examples show that military campaigns alone have never delivered lasting peace.

Nigeria has also had its fair share of war and armed conflict. On July 6, 1967, the country descended into a civil war following Lieutenant Colonel Chukwuemeka Odumegwu Ojukwu's declaration of the Republic of Biafra. The Federal Military Government under General Yakubu Gowon responded with military action, beginning a conflict that lasted until January 15, 1970. At the end of the war, nearly three million people had died, many from starvation and disease. Images of malnourished children from Biafra shocked the world and remain among the most enduring symbols of war's cruelty today. When the conflict finally ended, Nigeria turned towards the negotiation table. Gowon's declaration

of "No Victor, No Vanquished" acknowledged an important truth: military victory could end a fight, but rebuilding the nation requires political negotiation, accommodation, and healing.

Since Boko Haram's emergence in 2009, Nigeria has invested enormous resources in combating insurgency. Successive governments have combined military operations with deradicalisation programmes, community engagement initiatives, and regional cooperation efforts. While force has often been necessary to contain violence, experience has repeatedly shown that sustainable peace depends on addressing the underlying conditions that allow conflicts to flourish. A Nigerian proverb warns that 'the person who throws a stone into a crowded market cannot predict whose head it will strike'. The same principle applies to nations that choose war over peaceful negotiation, because conflicts rarely unfold as intended. They create consequences that extend across borders, generations, and economies. That is why the most important question arising from the Islamabad agreement is not who won. Did Washington achieve all its

objectives? Did Tehran emerge stronger? Did Israel improve its security position? Historians and analysts will debate these questions for years to come. A more important question, however, concerns what was lost: How many lives could have been saved if diplomacy had prevailed earlier? How many schools could have been built with the money spent on missiles? How many hospitals could have been equipped? How many jobs could have been created? How many families could have been spared grief? These and many more questions matter because they force us to examine war not through the lens of strategy but through the lens of humanity and the urgent value of dialogue.

The Islamabad Memorandum may have brought one dangerous chapter to a close. Still, it also serves as a reminder of an enduring truth: wars may demonstrate power, alter borders, or change political calculations, but they rarely provide the lasting answers their architects promised. More often, they leave behind debt, trauma, bitterness, and rebuilding costs that endure for generations. From WW1 through the US-Vietnam War, the Russian-Ukrainian War, and the Nigerian Civil War discussed above, the same destination keeps appearing: Dialogue! The tragedy, therefore, is not that nations negotiate, but that they often wait until thousands have died before doing so. As we continue to reflect on the Islamabad Agreement, perhaps the lesson is not merely about the United States, Iran, or Israel, but much more about humanity itself. Having evolved with remarkable skill at inventing new ways to wage wars, we also need to learn how to prevent them.

Preventing wars requires analysing avoidable factors and the bitter lessons that trigger them. The U.S.-Iran conflict stems from decades of political, military, and strategic tensions rather than a single event. Key factors include Iran's nuclear programme, competition for regional influence, U.S. military support for Israel, and Iran's backing of proxy armed groups. U.S. economic sanctions against Iran, repeated military confrontations, the collapse of diplomatic agreements, and immediate military strikes and retaliation have escalated into open conflict. All these actions would have been avoidable had the two countries and the United Nations protected the diplomatic agreement—dialogue—that could have prevented the collapse.

The U.S.-Iran war offers several important—and often bitter—lessons

for governments, militaries, and the international community. The first lesson is that it is easier to start a conflict than to end it. Ceasefires can be fragile, and unresolved issues can quickly reignite conflict. Once unleashed, war rarely follows a predictable path and often leaves behind a legacy of suffering long after the fighting ceases. Second, military superiority does not guarantee strategic success. A country may win battles or destroy military targets yet still struggle to achieve its long-term political objectives. Lasting peace depends on both diplomacy and military capability. Regional conflicts have global consequences: fighting involving Iran affected shipping routes, energy supplies, insurance costs, and global oil prices, demonstrating how a regional war can have worldwide economic effects.

For Nigeria, the crisis had immediate and severe effects. As the conflict escalated in late February, petrol prices were already a major concern, ranging between ₦730 and ₦880 per litre. Within weeks, those prices skyrocketed to between ₦1,270 and ₦1,400 per liter in different regions. These price increases left many commuters stranded and transport operators struggling to adjust fares. The impacts were significant, with higher transportation costs pushing up food prices. Average Nigerians now find that their salaries buy much less than they did just a few weeks earlier. This stark reality highlights Nigeria's vulnerability, even as an oil-producing country, to global price shocks stemming from its reliance on imported refined products. It is high time to shift from import dependence to local production, thanks to the Dangote Refinery.

Nigeria is blessed with people like Dangote, who invested billions of dollars to build a refinery for Nigeria and other African countries. We must give the refinery all the support it needs, especially a reliable supply of crude oil, to lower pump prices of oil, the bedrock of the modern economy, which can galvanise productivity gains and support the nation's development.

As we pray for the departed souls to rest in eternal peace, we must champion a review of the UN structures to enable it to acquire the necessary strength for global regulation and to serve as a diplomatic tool for resolving conflicts among nations without resorting to war. All member nations should support this fundamental review to help the world live in harmony. May God guide our leaders towards a peaceful and progressive world. Amen.

THE NDLEA N1.5TRN ILLICIT DRUG HAUL

In what appears to be its 18-month report, the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) made a major haul in the fight against illicit drugs and unwholesome substances. The agency arrested 29,262 suspected drug traffickers, seized illicit drugs worth over N1.5 trillion and secured the conviction of 5,225 offenders. The feat, without a doubt, marks a significant breakthrough in curbing drug abuse illicit trafficking in Nigeria.

Making the disclosure at the grand finale of activities marking the 2026 International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking in Abuja penultimate Friday, the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the NDLEA, Brig. Gen. Buba Marwa (retd.), said the agency had intensified intelligence-led operations against drug syndicates, leading to major breakthroughs in dismantling transnational trafficking networks.

He said the NDLEA, working with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration and law enforcement agencies in Greece, France, and Switzerland, recently dismantled the notorious Amadi Simon drug cartel. This “We have also successfully disrupted another international methamphetamine syndicate with the arrest of a 63-year-old Nigerian drug baron, Innocent Anochili, three Mexican nationals and six Nigerian accomplices,” he said.

Marwa added that the agency also uncovered and dismantled an industrial-scale clandestine methamphetamine laboratory in Tapa village, Ibarapa North local government area of Oyo state, where a Mexican national and four others were arrested.

“In the past five years, we have arrested no fewer than 234 suspected drug barons linked to major trafficking networks. In the last 18 months alone, the agency arrested 29,262 suspects, seized 5,305,484.88 kilogrammes of assorted illicit drugs valued at over N1.5 trillion and secured the conviction of 5,225 offenders.

“These numbers represent more than just data; they represent millions of lives saved, billions of naira in criminal wealth confiscated and a future reclaimed for our youths,” he said.

On drug prevention, Marwa said the agency had conducted 6,645 awareness campaigns under its War Against Drug Abuse initiative, reaching nearly five million Nigerians in schools, places of worship, workplaces,

markets, motor parks, communities and correctional facilities.

He added that 13,508 drug users had received counselling, treatment and rehabilitation across the agency’s 31 rehabilitation centres nationwide within the same period.

In his remarks, President Bola Ahmed Tinubu, who was represented by the Attorney General of the Federation and Minister of Justice, Lateef Fagbemi, reaffirmed his administration’s commitment to tackling substance abuse and illicit drug trafficking through stronger law enforcement, innovation and international collaboration.

Speaking on the theme, “The World Drug Problem: Persisting Issues, New Challenges, Innovative Responses,” the president said the federal government would continue to intensify efforts to dismantle drug cartels while addressing the root causes of substance abuse through the Renewed Hope Agenda.

Tinubu also commended Marwa and NDLEA personnel for recording increased arrests, seizures, convictions, asset forfeitures, rehabilitation programmes and the dismantling of organised drug trafficking networks, including those behind the country’s largest methamphetamine laboratories.

“These achievements stand as a testament to our administration’s zero tolerance for organised crime and an unwavering commitment to safeguarding society from the devastating effects of narcotics,” the president said.

He, however, stressed that government alone could not win the war against drug abuse, calling on parents, schools, religious and traditional leaders, the media and the private sector to support prevention, rehabilitation and awareness efforts.

Delivering the guest lecture, Prof. Oluwatoyin Odeku of the Department of Pharmaceutics and Industrial Pharmacy, University of Ibadan, said the country had recorded measurable progress in combating illicit drugs over the past five years.

“When the NDLEA was re-energised in 2021, many thought the drug war was unwinnable. Today, the data tells a different story, and we have reasons to celebrate,” she said.

Also speaking, the Country Representative of the United Nations Office

on Drugs and Crime, Cheikh Touré, represented by Dr Akanidomo Ibanga, commended the Federal Government for adopting what he described as a balanced and evidence-based approach to drug control.

He reaffirmed the UN agency’s commitment to supporting Nigeria through technical assistance, partnerships and innovative solutions to tackle the country’s evolving drug challenges.

It is instructive that the anti-drug agency recently disrupted a methamphetamine syndicate in what is the country’s largest seizure to date. It seized drugs and precursor chemicals valued at \$363 million and arrested 10 people, including three from Mexico, in Ogun state. In the same vein, on May 20, 2026, the agency announced that coordinated raids on a farm in Ogun state and related properties in Lagos state uncovered an industrial-scale clandestine meth lab and seized 2.4 tonnes of methamphetamine along with chemical materials.

For the benefit of hindsight, methamphetamine is a toxic substance which contains industrial chemicals, solvents, and reactive materials that pose significant risks of explosion, fire, and environmental contamination.

It is against the backdrop of the cataclysmic effects of methamphetamine and other illicit drugs on the environment and human beings that Blueprint lauds the NDLEA for its commitment and zeal at curbing the fatal illicit drug trade which cuts across African and other international trade routes. It has been established that drug abuse is one of major causes of mental disorder, untimely death, insecurity, youth delinquency, and the high rate of divorce in the country.

This newspaper also commends the Renewed Hope administration of President Tinubu for its determination to nip the illicit drug trade in the bud. We, particularly, note the series of pragmatic programmes and legal frameworks formulated by the federal government towards ensuring the success of the war against the trafficking of illicit drugs and unwholesome substances.

It is, however, expedient to draw attention to widespread misgivings on the slow or non-prosecution and conviction of suspects of illicit drug trade. This should be addressed in order to instill confidence in the drug war as well as serve as deterrence to would-be offenders.

# ALAUSA’S TRANSFORMATIVE LEADERSHIP IN EDUCATION

Education remains the bedrock of national development, and the quality of leadership within the sector often determines the pace of a nation’s progress. In Nigeria, the ongoing reforms spearheaded by the Minister of Education, Dr Maruf Alausa alongside the Minister of State for Education, Prof. Suwaiba Ahmad, are gradually redefining the landscape of learning, skills acquisition, innovation, and youth empowerment.

# Tinubu inaugurates Presidential Working Group on National Policing Bill

President Bola Ahmed Tinubu on Tuesday inaugurated the Presidential Working Group on the National Policing Bill to prepare the legal framework for the implementation of State Police across the country.

President Tinubu, represented by his Chief of Staff, Femi Gbajabiamila, inaugurated the panel at the Presidential Villa, Abuja.

The inauguration followed the National Assembly's passage of the Constitution Alteration (State Police) Bill, 2026, in which the President proposes a dual policing structure comprising the Federal Police Service and 36 State Police Services.

The President said that while the constitutional amendment creates the framework for state police, the National Policing Bill would provide the legal structure for its implementation.

"The Constitution Amendment Bill establishes the framework for dual policing, but it does not operationalise it. That work is left to the National Policing Bill."

He said the proposed legislation would address issues necessary for a smooth operationalisation of the State Police system.

"The proposed National Policing Bill will include provisions on minimum policing standards, state readiness certification, federal-state coordination, accountability, human rights safeguards and fiscal conditions."

The President said that the committee will produce an implementation-ready draft bill immediately after the constitutional amendment process.

"The Working Group has been constituted to produce a technically robust, implementation-ready draft National Policing Bill for transmission to the National Assembly," Tinubu said.

He said the committee was necessary to avoid delays after the State Police bill passed.

"We must not wait until the constitutional process is concluded before beginning this important assignment," he said.

Gbajabiamila will serve as the committee's chairman. Members include the Attorney-General of the Federation, the President of the Nigerian Bar Association (NBA), the Chairman of the Nigeria Governors' Forum (NGF), the National Security Adviser, the Inspector-General of Police, the Chairman of the NGF Committee on State Police. A Secretariat will offer some administrative assistance to the committee.

Governor Dapo Abiodun of Ogun state, on behalf of the NGF, pledged governors' support for the speedy implementation of the reform.

He said the plan is for the 36 state governors to accelerate work on the bill once it reaches their respective Houses of Assembly and is passed unanimously.

Abiodun described the proposed state police as a response to Nigerians' long-standing demand for community-based policing.

"This bill has answered the cries of Nigerians about cascading policing and removing it from the Exclusive

Legislative List."

He said the initiative validated the success of regional security outfits such as Amotekun in the South-West.

Abiodun said the state police would significantly increase the number of security personnel nationwide.

"If each state deploys about 6,000 personnel, we will add nearly 200,000 officers to complement the existing federal police."

The governor commended President Tinubu for initiating implementation plans before the constitutional amendment process was completed.

"This inauguration demonstrates the proactiveness of the Executive in preparing for effective implementation,"

Abiodun said.

The Attorney-General of the Federation and Minister of Justice, Lateef Fagbemi, SAN, described the initiative as timely in view of Nigeria's security challenges.

"There is no denying the fact that we are in a critical moment security-wise, and all hands must be on deck," he said.

President of the Nigerian Bar Association (NBA), Mr Afam Osigwe, reaffirmed the association's support for the state police initiative.

"Nigeria can hardly be effectively policed by one national police. We fully support the constitutional amendment providing for state police," he said.

Osigwe, however, stressed the need

for adequate legal safeguards to prevent abuse of state police.

"We must ensure we do not create a monster. The right legal framework must guarantee accountability and prevent oppression," he said.

He pledged the NBA's commitment to supporting the committee in producing legislation that will strengthen security while protecting citizens' rights.

Also present at the inauguration were the Attorneys-General and Commissioners for Justice of Plateau, Lagos and Ondo states, the representatives of the Inspector General and the National Security Adviser and senior government officials.

## PSC dismisses 4 senior officers, sanctions 31 others

The Police Service Commission (PSC) has approved the dismissal of four Senior Police Officers and issued a range of disciplinary measures against 31 others following various acts of misconduct.

A press statement by the head, Protocol and Public Relations, Torty Kalu, said the decision was reached at the commission's plenary meeting held at its Corporate Headquarters in Abuja.

He said the four dismissed officers were found culpable of gross misconduct, unprofessional conduct and acts unbecoming of public officers.

Kalu stated that in addition to the dismissals, the commission approved a range of disciplinary actions which affected multiple officers.

"Ten senior officers received reductions in rank: three Superintendents of Police (SPs) were reduced to Deputy Superintendents of Police (DSPs), two DSPs were reduced to Assistant Superintendents of Police (ASP), and five ASPs were reduced to Inspectors. Two officers were also compulsorily retired in the public interest."

"Other sanctions included severe reprimands issued to 10 officers, reprimands to five officers, warning letters to three officers, and a letter of advice to one officer. In addition, seven officers were exonerated and cleared of wrongdoing."

The Spokesperson said the chairman of the commission, DIG Hashimu Argungu (rtd.), stated the board's zero-tolerance stance on indiscipline within the Nigeria Police Force.

## Fake agency: No petition before us to dabble into controversy – Senate

The Senate Tuesday through its spokesperson, Senator Yemi Adaramodu (Ekiti South), said there was no petition before the red chamber to dabble into controversy of alleged fake agency reportedly headed by a fake Director General, Adeniyi Adeyemi Mathew.

Controversy had engulfed the polity over an allegedly non-existent Presidential Foreign Intervention Promotion Council (PFIPC) directly between the alleged fake DG and the Chief of Staff to President Bola Tinubu, Hon Femi Gbajabiamila in the past one week.

While the Chief of Staff disowned the agency and its purported DG by

raising the alarm, the DG countered by alleging that PFIPC is well known to the Presidency through Gbajabiamila who according to him, collected N 400 Million from him for the appointment and demanded 48% from the N1.3 billion appropriated for the agency in the 2026 budget.

Speaking on the Senate's position on the raging controversy to journalists after plenary, Senator Adaramodu said the Senate for now, has no petition before it from any of the feuding parties or concerned Nigerians to warrant any form of intervention or comments.

He admitted that as reported in the media, the alleged fake agency has a budget line in the 2026 appropriation Act which should be

sorted out by the executive where the controversy came from and resides with.

He added that being an already litigated controversy, the Senate in line with its rules, would not dabble into it.

"The allegations and counter allegations over fake agency and fake director - general are all within the executive, which should be sorted out by it, specifically between the office of the Chief of Staff and the alleged fake DG."

"The budget line being referred to was not created or inserted by the National Assembly and it is not the duty of the Senate or the House of Representatives to carry out security checks on those supposedly appointed to head the various MDAs," he said.

## Reps blast AGF over non-responsive attitude, insist on Monday appearance

The House of Representatives Committee on Public Accounts Tuesday expressed concern at the non-responsive attitude of Accountant-General of the Federation (AGF), Mr. Shamseldeen Babatunde Ogunjimi, describing his conduct as unbecoming of the country's chief accountant.

"The Public Accounts Committee is worried that the Accountant General of the Federation is not showing any diligence in the rendering of accounts of his office and the preparation of the country's consolidated financial statements, thus setting a bad example for other agencies of government.

"The Office of the Accountant-General occupies a strategic position in Nigeria's public financial management system. As a critical institution entrusted with the management of public finances, it is expected to work closely with the committee in the discharge of its oversight responsibilities," he stated.

## Cardiac surgeon Aghaji arrested over alleged economic crime – NMA

The Nigeria Medical Association (NMA) has said Consultant Cardiac Surgeon, Prof Martin Aghaji, was arrested and detained by the Department of State Services (DSS) over alleged economic crime.

A statement by the chairman, NMA, Lagos state, Dr Babajide Kehinde Saheed, noted that: "Consultant Cardiac Surgeon, Prof (Dr) Martin Aghaji, was arrested on Thursday, July 2, 2026 by the DSS in his house in Enugu and flown to the DSS Lagos state command for alleged economic crime.

"The director of Lagos state DSS command informed NMA Lagos state about the arrest of Prof Martin Aghaji and invited NMA to the Lagos command in view of the good relationship between Lagos state DSS command and NMA Lagos state."

The statement said, "On behalf of the Prof Afekhide Omotiled NOC, a team comprising of Prof Olayinka Atilola (National Publicity Secretary), Dr Babajide Saheed (Chairman NMA Lagos), Dr Bisoye Akinsulire (Publicity Secretary, NMA Lagos) and Dr Placid Ajachukwu (Rep of NMA Enugu state) were at the Lagos office of the DSS Sunday, July 5, 2026.

"Prof Martin Aghaji was released on bail to the NMA team on liberal terms without any pressure, perfected by the team."

The NMA chairman noted that, "The details of the alleged economic crime offence and other information remains classified to protect ongoing investigations."

## Use your power of contempt sparingly, CJN tells new judges

The Chief Justice of Nigeria (CJN), Justice Kudirat Kekere-Ekun, Tuesday, cautioned judges against excessive use of their power of contempt.

Kekere-Ekun, who advocated further that it should be used sparingly added that "it may backfire."

She gave the advice at the opening of an induction course for new judges held in Abuja.

At the ceremony, Kekere-Ekun charged them to ensure speedy and

fair determination of cases before them.

The CJN also warned the newly appointed judges of the lower courts against accepting unsolicited gifts, cautioning that doing so could land them in trouble

Represented at the event by the administrator of the National Judicial Institute (NJI), Justice Babatunde Adejumo, Kekere-Ekun stated the importance of synergy between judges and court officials, especially the registrars and exhibit keepers.

She stated further that only expeditious hearing of cases would

ensure the continued confidence of litigants in the judiciary.

"You must work harmoniously with all the officials under you and ensure that you manage them diplomatically and technically.

"You must also read the rules of courts so that lawyers will not take you for a ride. Read everything that comes before you.

"Most importantly, do not allow unsolicited gifts. You must equally avoid throwing unnecessary birthday parties. People will seize the opportunity to bring unsolicited gifts that can lead to petitions.

"As judges of the lower courts, you play a key role in the judiciary. Ensure that you are not rude to your heads of court.

"I will also enjoin you not to use your power of contempt too much. It should be used sparingly, otherwise it may backfire," the CJN said.

Giving a welcome address at the event, the NJI Administrator, Justice Adejumo, congratulated the new judges, urging them to be mindful of the fact that they have been entrusted with the sacred duty of upholding constitutional supremacy.

## FCT-IRS rolls out Taxporta to simplify new tax regime

The Federal Capital Territory Internal Revenue Service (FCT-IRS) has launched Taxporta, a new digital tax management platform that enables taxpayers to register, file returns, pay taxes and obtain Tax Clearance Certificates online to modernise tax administration and drive voluntary compliance under Nigeria's 2025 tax reforms.

The platform was unveiled during a stakeholders' engagement with Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) at the National Assembly Library Trust Fund Complex in Abuja, where the executive chairman of FCT-

IRS, Michael Ango, said the initiative marks a significant milestone in the service's digital transformation agenda.

Ango said the upgraded platform is designed to make tax administration more efficient by allowing taxpayers to complete virtually all tax-related transactions remotely without visiting FCT-IRS offices.

"Any serious institution, whether in the public or private sector, must move with the times. This is a continuation of our digital innovation process to ensure taxpayers can access our services from the comfort of their homes or offices without having to visit our offices physically," he said.

He stated that Taxporta is a fully integrated self-service platform

through which taxpayers can register, file tax returns, calculate tax liabilities, make payments, generate receipts and obtain Tax Clearance Certificates without third-party assistance.

Ango noted that the portal has been configured to reflect the provisions of the new tax laws, automatically applying statutory reliefs and allowances once taxpayers input their income details.

"All the allowances provided under the law have already been embedded into the system. Taxpayers simply provide their income information, while the platform computes their tax liabilities, processes payments and generates tax clearance certificates," he added.

The All Progressives Congress (APC) has declared that it never handed over tickets to people who never participated in its primaries, insisting all substitutions were done in conformity with laid down rules.

It also dismissed insinuations that the review was manipulated to favour certain interests.

Speaking Tuesday on early morning show on Arise Television, APC National Publicity Secretary, Felix Morka, said the party received more than 720 petitions from aggrieved aspirants after the primaries and treated each one before making changes.

“We received over 720 petitions from those who contested in that election. These petitions were reviewed by the appeal committees. Recommendations were made to the National Working Committee,” Morka said.

According to him, the NWC went further to “re-evaluate those cases” before arriving at the final list.

“And at the end of them, we made those changes that you are discussing. So these are legitimate outcomes of our primaries,” he added.

Morka pushed back against claims that the APC violated the Electoral Act by replacing candidates after the primaries, contending that primaries are not just about voting.

“Primary election is a process. It’s not an event. The appeal process is an integral part of the primary election process. It’s not a separate process, and

it’s not a process invented by the party to cause mischief,” he said.

On allegations that the party gave tickets to people who didn’t buy forms or show up for screening, the APC spokesman said he was not aware of any such case.

“I’m not aware of any such case that you are alluding to about those who didn’t participate, who never bought forms, who were not screened, who didn’t participate in primaries, all of a sudden handed tickets.

“Look, I’m not aware. If you have any such example, please mention it, and I will go back and do my own investigation,” Morka said.

He admitted that not everyone would be happy with the outcome, but said the party made efforts to be fair.

“When they don’t win, naturally some people definitely have a reason to be dissatisfied. And this is why we took our time to go through these appeal processes to make sure that there was no case we didn’t give the time of day to thoroughly review,” said the party’s publicity scribe.

He said: “What we say to them is that everyone cannot be flag bearer. Our engagements are already on to reach individuals like this, to reassure them that this is not personal. Nothing

has been done that is arbitrary. Nobody has just been favoured with tickets.”

### ...Party urges members to close rank for Tinubu

In a related development, the ruling party called on its members nationwide to close ranks and mobilise for the re-election of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu ahead of the 2027 general elections.

Deputy National Chairman (South) of the party, Benjamin Obi Nwoye, also assured that the party would recognise and reward the sacrifices of its founding members.

Nwoye made the call Tuesday while receiving members of the G37—a coalition of former state chairmen of the defunct Action Congress of Nigeria (ACN) and other legacy parties—as well as party stakeholders, during a courtesy visit to the APC National Headquarters in Abuja.

The APC chieftain described the visit as emotional and a reminder that the struggle that birthed the ruling party was far from over.

“We are not at the end yet. We are not even at the middle. We are still at the beginning of the struggle,” he said, while expressing appreciation to members who travelled from different

parts of the country despite logistical challenges.

He urged party faithful not to lose hope over delayed political appointments, assuring them that President Tinubu remained mindful of those who contributed to the formation and growth of the APC.

“My plea is that you should remain steadfast. Asiwaju is not someone who forgets. By the grace of God, he has a good memory,” Nwoye stated.

The deputy national chairman stressed that although the legacy parties that formed the APC—including ACN, CPC and ANPP—no longer exist officially, their histories and contributions should continue to be acknowledged.

“There is nothing wrong with remembering our roots. It is not division; it is understanding our foundation,” he said, adding that the APC’s strength lies in its unity as a “Rainbow Coalition.”

Nwoye further charged members to resist distractions from the opposition and intensify grassroots mobilisation ahead of the 2027 polls, arguing that the Tinubu administration had delivered visible infrastructure projects across the country.

According to him, improved road

networks across the South-East and South-South regions are evidence of the administration’s commitment to national development.

He also pledged that the party leadership would continue to advocate for the welfare of loyal members, insisting that those who laid the foundation of the APC should never be abandoned.

### ...Group’s leader

Earlier, leader of the G37 and former ACN state chairman, Comrade Cletus Obum, reaffirmed the group’s loyalty to the APC and congratulated Nwoye on his emergence as Deputy National Chairman (South).

Obum described Nwoye as a compassionate and accessible leader whose personal interventions had provided financial and emotional support to families of deceased party leaders.

He urged the APC leadership to ensure that pioneers and legacy members of the party were adequately recognised through appointments and participation in party structures.

“The people who built this party should not be left standing outside the corridors of power,” he said.

Obum also traced the history of the APC merger, arguing that the process began as far back as 2004 with discussions involving the defunct Alliance for Democracy, the Advanced Congress of Democrats and other opposition groups, eventually leading to the formation of the Action Congress and later the Action Congress of Nigeria before the APC was established.

He appealed to the party leadership to preserve the ideals of progressive politics by rewarding loyalty and ensuring that founding members remained integral to the party’s future.

The meeting ended with both leaders reaffirming their commitment to strengthening the APC ahead of the 2027 general elections and maintaining unity within the ruling party.

## Nigeria’s oil output hits 1.8mbpd, FG, NNPC, IPPG push for gas transition

Nigeria’s energy sector has recorded a significant turnaround, with crude oil production rebounding to over 1.8 million barrels per day (mbpd), inclusive of condensates, Minister of State for Petroleum Resources (Oil), Senator Heineken Lokpobiri, has disclosed.

This milestone set the tone for intense deliberations at the opening ceremony of the silver jubilee edition of the Nigerian Oil and Gas (NOG) Energy Week Tuesday in Abuja, where top government officials, regulatory chiefs, and private sector leaders gathered to shape the country’s energy future.

The four-day premier energy event at the Bola Ahmed Tinubu International Conference Centre served as a platform for the federal government to showcase the early fruits of its regulatory reforms, even as industry operators called for a comprehensive review of the Petroleum Industry Act (PIA) 2021 to align it with current economic realities.

### ...Oil production rebound and regulatory streamlining

Declaring the 25th NOG Energy Week open, the minister disclosed that the nation’s crude oil production has climbed to over 1.8 mbpd, representing a massive leap from the low levels of approximately one million barrels per day recorded when he assumed office in August 2023.

According to the minister, the rapid recovery is a direct consequence of a clear directive from President Bola Ahmed Tinubu to eliminate deep-seated administrative and operational bottlenecks clogging the upstream sector.

“Today, I get weekly reports from the Nigerian Upstream Petroleum Regulatory Commission (NUPRC)... the last one I got this week is that we are doing over 1.8 million barrels a day,” Lokpobiri told the gathering of global energy executives.

Lokpobiri attributed the output surge to a renewed wave of investor confidence, which has revitalised

drilling activities across the Niger Delta. He revealed that the number of active drilling rigs in the country had risen from a mere 14 in 2023 to more than 60 currently.

### ...Concerns over exit of IOCs

Addressing concerns regarding the recent exit of international oil companies (IOCs) from onshore assets, Lokpobiri clarified that “no IOC has abandoned Nigeria. Instead, they are strategically reallocating capital to complex deep offshore acreages where they possess a distinct competitive advantage, leaving onshore and shallow-water assets to robust indigenous firms.”

He highlighted key domestic acquisitions, including Renaissance’s takeover of Shell’s onshore assets, Seplat’s acquisition of ExxonMobil, and Oando’s purchase of the Nigerian Agip Oil Company.

“Independents now account for over 60 per cent of our daily production of 1.8 million barrels per day,” Lokpobiri stated.

He commended Renaissance and its joint venture partners for a recent significant offshore oil discovery in OML-74.

To further lower the cost of doing business and boost competitiveness, the minister announced that the federal government had commissioned PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) to conduct a global benchmarking exercise on the more than 270 fees, taxes, and levies currently charged by various government agencies across the oil and gas value chain with the explicit goal of streamlining them.

### ...Deepening energy ecosystem

In his keynote address, the Group Chief Executive Officer of the Nigerian National Petroleum Company (NNPC) Limited, Engineer Bashir Bayo Ojulari, advocated for an integrated ecosystem-driven approach in industry collaboration.

He argued that weak linkages between asset owners, financiers, and technology partners remained the primary barrier limiting Africa’s ability to attract global energy capital.

Ojulari reported that NNPC Ltd’s

aggressive operational interventions have yielded unprecedented stability.

Between April 2025 and May 2026, he said, the national oil company “recorded an average recovery rate of 98 per cent across its five primary crude oil export terminals. This marks a dramatic turnaround from June 2022, when security and operational challenges dragged recovery rates at the Bonny Oil and Gas Terminal down to an absolute low of about one per cent.”

## PFIPC: Gbajabiamila threatens N10bn suit, Tinubu orders ICPC probe

The Chief of Staff to the President, Rt. Hon. Femi Gbajabiamila, Tuesday, threatened to institute a N10 billion defamation suit and criminal proceedings against ‘Director General’ of the controversial Presidential Foreign Intervention Promotion Council (PFIPC), Prince Adeniyi Adeyemi Matthew.

Gbajabiamila’s threat followed what he described as damaging and defamatory claims that he demanded 48 per cent of the alleged take-off grant of PFIPC and received N400 million through proxies in connection with appointments into the organisation among others.

However, the legal threat is with a caveat that he (Adeniyi) retracts and apologises via a widely circulated press conference within 72 hours, the defamatory charge, according to a demand conveyed in a cease-and-desist letter dated July 6, 2026 by his solicitors, Pinheiro LP, and signed by Senior Advocate of Nigeria, Kemi Pinheiro and made available to newsmen in Abuja on Tuesday.

The law firm said it was acting on the instructions of Gbajabiamila, whom it described as “one of Nigeria’s most accomplished public servants” whose reputation had been built over decades of public service as a lawyer, former Speaker of the House of Representatives and now Chief of Staff to the President.

According to the letter, the firm’s client’s attention had been drawn to a press conference addressed by Prince Matthew on June 25, 2026, which was subsequently circulated across print, electronic and social media platforms.

The law firm maintained that all the allegations were false and defamatory

### ...Tinubu orders

Meanwhile, President Bola Ahmed Tinubu has directed the Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences Commission (ICPC) to conduct a thorough investigation into the activities of PFIPC and all related matters.

The President directed that the investigation be concluded and a comprehensive report submitted to him within 30 days.

The directive follows the discovery of the fictitious PFIPC, which was never established by the federal government and has no basis in any law, presidential instrument, executive approval, or other lawful act of Government.

Among the issues to be investigated by the ICPC are the forged appointment letters and other official government documents; the use of a false claim of presidential appointment to seek or obtain official recognition and diplomatic support, including visa facilitation; and the opening of multiple bank accounts in the names of purported government agencies using allegedly forged documents.

President Tinubu directed the ICPC to investigate not only the conduct of the principal individual and other collaborators involved but also the wider circumstances that may have enabled a fictitious body and a false claim of presidential appointment to acquire an appearance of official legitimacy.

The investigation is to examine the provenance and use of false official documents; the processes through which official recognition or diplomatic support may have been sought or obtained; the opening and operation of any related bank accounts; the source and movement of any funds involved; and the role of any public officer, private individual, financial institution, intermediary or other person or entity that may have facilitated, enabled or participated in the alleged scheme.

The President directed the Commission to identify any weaknesses in government and institutional procedures that may have been exploited and to recommend immediate measures to prevent the recurrence of similar abuses.

All ministries, departments and agencies of the federal government have been directed to provide the ICPC, upon lawful request, with all relevant information, records and assistance required for the expeditious completion of the investigation.

The President directed that all persons found culpable be treated strictly in accordance with applicable law.

*Idoma nation mourns ex-Benue SSG Salifu, demands justice over killing*

The Ochetoha K’Idoma Forum has expressed deep sorrow over the killing of former Secretary to the Government (SSG) of Benue state, Professor David Onu Salifu, describing his death as a monumental loss to the Idoma nation, Benue state and Nigeria.

The socio-cultural organisation also called on security agencies to ensure that those responsible for the attack are apprehended and prosecuted, warning that the continued wave of insecurity on Nigerian highways and in rural communities has become unacceptable.

In a statement, the forum said Professor Salifu, a renowned academic and former Benue SSG, was brutally murdered by armed men Thursday, along the Wukari–Makurdi highway while travelling to his hometown to attend the burial of a beloved uncle.

The group said the late professor was reportedly dragged out of his vehicle by the attackers, shot at close range and left critically wounded before he was eventually taken to the Federal Medical Centre, Makurdi, where he succumbed to his injuries in the early hours of Friday.

The forum described the circumstances surrounding his death as heartbreaking and unacceptable, noting that Nigeria had once again lost one of its finest administrators, scholars and community leaders to violent crime.

The Ochetoha K’Idoma Forum said Professor Salifu’s life exemplified the values of humility, diligence, patriotism and service to humanity. It noted that his journey from the grassroots to the highest levels of public service reflected determination and commitment to excellence.

According to the statement, the late academic began his career as an administrative officer in the local government system, where he gained practical experience in governance and public administration before steadily rising through the ranks.

His outstanding record in public service eventually earned him appointment as Secretary to the Government of Benue State, a position he held between 2011 and 2015 during the administration of former Governor Gabriel Suswam.

The forum stated that while serving as SSG, Professor Salifu distinguished himself through sound administrative leadership, intellectual depth and a practical understanding of governance, earning the respect of colleagues across political divides.

# Extortion: Enugu bans task force operations on federal highways

Worried by the activities of fake enforcement officials and unbridled extortion of motorists, especially on federal highways in Enugu state, the Enugu state Ministry of Transport has banned all traffic task force operations on federal highways across the Enugu metropolis.

This is to curb the activities of fake enforcement officials accused of extorting motorists.

The directive was contained in a statement issued Tuesday by the Commander of the Enugu State Traffic Management Authority (ESTMA), Mr. Kenneth Aniebonam Ugwu.

The ministry said it took the decision following reports that impostors posing as officials had been operating on federal highways, harassing and extorting motorists, thereby tarnishing the image of the ministry.

To address the situation, the ministry said it has constituted a special team to identify and apprehend those behind the illegal operations.

The statement stated that

some suspected fake task force operatives were recently arrested while allegedly extorting motorists

in different parts of the Enugu metropolis.

It added that the suspects are

currently undergoing interrogation and would be prosecuted in accordance with the law.

# State Police: CCC demands speedy legal frameworks, warns against identity politics

The Centre for Crisis Communication (CCC) has reiterated its support for the establishment of state policing as part of broader security sector reforms to tackle Nigeria’s pressing security challenges.

Speaking at a press briefing in Abuja on the Second Quarter 2026 National Security and Stability Report, the chairman of CCC, Maj.-Gen Chris Olukolade (rtd), cautioned that the constitutional, legal, and institutional frameworks required for its implementation must not face unnecessary delays. It also called for robust safeguards to ensure professionalism and protect the system against abuse.

“Considering the growing public consensus that state policing

represents a more responsive and effective approach to addressing Nigeria’s security challenges, the Centre reiterates its support for the establishment of state police,” the CCC stated.

The independent think-tank also strongly condemned the dangerous trend of political actors weaponising ethnic and religious identities to score cheap political points ahead of the next electoral cycle. It warned that such divisive narratives steadily undermine the country’s hard-earned gains in national unity.

“Political leaders must therefore demonstrate greater responsibility by promoting national cohesion rather than exploiting existing fault lines for partisan interests,” the Centre noted.

To address other dimensions of national stability, the CCC urged the federal government

and security agencies to prioritise specialised training and capacity building to improve response times during kidnapping incidents and emergencies.

Simultaneously, it admonished the media and public commentators to refrain from sensationalising security operations, noting that responsible reporting is essential to “denying criminal elements the publicity they often seek”.

Advocating for a unified front, the CCC called on government institutions, security agencies, civil society, and citizens to collaborate in combating misinformation and building national resilience. It stated that overcoming Nigeria’s complex security issues ultimately requires a whole-of-society approach anchored on strategic communication and responsible leadership.

Borno: 2 high profile terrorist commanders surrender, provide intelligence on operations

Initial intelligence obtained from the debriefing has provided valuable insights into the terrorists' operational methods, sustainment mechanisms and support networks.

The information is expected to significantly enhance ongoing intelligence-led operations aimed at locating, disrupting and dismantling remaining terrorist enclaves across the North east Theatre.

The surrender of the two commanders represents another major setback for the terrorist faction and further validates the effectiveness of the sustained offensive operations being conducted by troops of Operation

HADIN KAI in conjunction with partners.

The relentless military pressure, supported by coordinated land and air operations as well as enhanced intelligence efforts, continues to deny the terrorists freedom of movement, degrade their combat capability and erode their command and control structures.

Increasingly, terrorist leaders and fighters are finding continued resistance untenable, compelling them to abandon the insurgency and surrender to troops.

This latest development further reinforces the growing disintegration of the terrorist organisation and reflects the cumulative impact of sustained military operations across the Theatre.

Police arrest 150, recover 100 motorcycles, firearms in Lagos crackdown

The Lagos state Police Command has arrested 150 suspected criminals and recovered 100 unregistered motorcycles, firearms, stolen property and illicit drugs during a major security operation carried out across criminal hideouts in the state.

This was contained in a statement

by the command's spokesperson, SP Adebisi Abimbola, who stated that the operation conducted under the ongoing Operation KO S'AYE, targeted criminal hideouts at Boolar, Okofilling Bus stop, Igando, and other identified black spots within the Area M, Idimu axis.

She said the raid was carried out at about 5:45 a.m. on Sunday following credible intelligence.

She added that the coordinated operation involved a joint team of operatives drawn from different formations of the Lagos state Police command and was aimed at flushing out hoodlums and other criminal elements terrorising the affected communities.

Items recovered during the operation include 100 unregistered motorcycles, 54 mobile phones, one double-barrel gun, two single-barrel guns, one locally made double-barrel short gun, two military camouflage uniforms, assorted charms, six generators suspected to have been stolen, substances suspected to be Indian hemp and various quantities of illicit drugs.

The police spokesperson stated that all the suspects are currently in police custody while investigations are ongoing to determine their individual involvement in criminal activities.

She added that suspects found culpable would be prosecuted in accordance with the law.

Commending the operatives for their professionalism and dedication, the Commissioner of Police, Lagos state command, CP Tijani Fatai, reaffirmed the command's commitment to sustaining the ongoing Operation KO S'AYE across the state.

PDP practically defunct, says Oyo legislative candidates

Venus Williams wins Wimbledon for the first time

On July 8, 2000, Venus Williams wins at Wimbledon for the first time. Her victory over defending champion, Lindsay Davenport, made Williams the first Black female Wimbledon champion since Althea Gibson won back-to-back titles in 1957 and 1958.

Overcoming a tough childhood in Compton, California, Williams became a champion women's tennis player with seven Grand Slam singles titles, 16 Grand Slam doubles titles and four Olympic gold medals. Williams and her sister Serena are considered two of the greatest tennis players of all time.

Williams was born on June 17, 1980, in Lynwood, California. Her father, a self-taught tennis coach, trained his daughters on the local courts. When Williams was 10 years old, the family relocated to West Palm Beach, Florida so Venus and Serena could attend a tennis academy.

By the age of 10, Williams' serve topped off at an impressive 100 miles per hour. Thanks to that serve and athletic prowess on the court, Williams was 63-0 on the United States Tennis Association junior tour.

On October 31, 1994, Williams turned pro at 14 years old. In 1997, she became the first woman since Pam Shriver in 1978 to reach the final of her first U.S. Open. In 1998, she won her first Grand Slam at the Australian Open. A year later, she won the French Open women's doubles tournament with her sister.

When Williams won at Wimbledon in 2000, she said, "It's really great because I've been working so hard all my life to be here... It's

strange. I'd go to bed at night and I'd dream I'd won a Grand Slam, but when I woke up, there was the nightmare. Now, I don't have to wake up like that anymore."

That same year she went on to win the U.S. Open, two gold medals at the 2000 Summer Olympic Games in Sydney and signed a \$40 million sponsorship deal with Reebok.

In 2011, Williams revealed she was battling Sjögren syndrome, a chronic, incurable immune system disorder. Many expected her to take a step back from tennis. Instead, she went on to win gold at the 2012 Summer Olympics and the women's doubles title at Wimbledon.

## Is NYSC reform another uniform makeover?

In a country where “national service” has too often translated into national sacrifice, the federal government has rolled out what it calls the most comprehensive overhaul of the National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) in its 53-year history. Approved by the Federal Executive Council (FEC), the reforms promise a shift to civilian operational leadership, technology-driven call-ups, extended orientation camps, specialised career streams, and a spiffy new uniform to replace the threadbare, sweat-inducing khaki that has defined generations of reluctant graduates.

One can almost hear the applause in Abuja. Meanwhile, parents across the federation exhale a cautious sigh, wondering if this time, the scheme might stop sending their children into harm's way dressed as moving targets.

Born with noble intentions after the Civil War to foster unity in a fractured nation, the 1973 relic has frequently functioned as a one-year lottery with appalling odds. The official rhetoric behind these new reforms aims to change that, transforming the NYSC into a “skills-driven, productivity-focused engine” capable of feeding a projected \$1 trillion economy.

Under the new playbook, the traditional three-week camp stretches to six weeks, structured into neat, corporate-friendly fortnights. The first two weeks for civic responsibility and national values (the traditional patriotism booster shot); week 3-4, career mapping, business planning, and basic accounting (to teach corps members how to budget their allowances against skyrocketing inflation) and 5-6, specialised training across 11 career tracks, including tech, agriculture, and health.

Primary assignments will better align with academic backgrounds, reducing the spectacle of engineering graduates teaching primary school pupils with no materials. The traditional, sweat-soaked Passing Out Parade will also yield to a “formal graduation ceremony.”

Sarcasm aside, these elements deserve genuine applause. Civilian leadership might inject fresh administrative energy, unburdened by military hierarchy, provided it doesn't devolve into another layer of political patronage.

More importantly, however, the corporate buzzwords dance gracefully around the elephant in the room, one that isn't wearing a

newly redesigned uniform, but rather carrying an AK-47 on an unpoliced highway. For over a decade, the greatest hazard of national service hasn't been the lack of running water, but a terrifying game of geographical roulette. Corps members, fresh out of university and brimming with youthful idealism, are posted to unfamiliar territories where they must dodge banditry, secessionist violence, and kidnapping syndicates. The mandatory journey to service has become a multi-day gauntlet through highway badlands where a corper's uniform behaves less like a shield of state protection and more like a neon sign for ransom negotiators. Recent tragedies, including the killing of corps member Abdulsamad Jamiu in Abuja, are painful reminders that “service” sometimes ends in an obituary.

To its credit, the new framework mentions a “risk-sensitive deployment” system. Details, however, remain scarce. While operational leadership pivots to civilians, the military is expected to handle security. This creates a spectacular paradox: we are demilitarising the administration at the exact moment the operational environment requires tactical

counter-insurgency expertise. A civilian director-general using a digital call-up process cannot algorithmically dissolve a bandit checkpoint.

Without a radical overhaul, “risk-sensitive deployment” will simply become bureaucratic shorthand for sending the children of the elite to Lagos and Abuja. Meanwhile, the politically invisible will continue to test their faith in the hinterlands.

True reform demands more than policy pronouncements and prettier khaki. If the NYSC is to transform from an existential gamble into a genuine national asset, the government must implement actionable security and structural updates:

First things first, establish a digital shield. Every corps member deployed to a medium- or high-risk zone should be integrated into a tech-enabled early-warning network. The NYSC mobile app should feature mandatory, zero-data check-ins and instantaneous SOS routing directly to localised military and police rapid-response units.

Second, create commercialised local placement. If the private sector wants to attract elite talent from the tech or medical streams, it must pay a mandatory security premium into an expanded NYSC Welfare and Protection Fund. These corporate sponsorships should guarantee secure, gated accommodation at Primary Places of Assignment (PPAs).

Third, set up the regional cluster model. National integration loses its charm when it requires crossing geopolitical zones via unsecured roads. The scheme should adopt a decentralised model where corps members are deployed outside their home states, but strictly within neighbouring states or secure corridors where safe transit infrastructure actually exists.

Besides, the corps must institute accountability and alternative paths. Here, I'm thinking hybrid or virtual models for high-risk zones. Furthermore, when corps members die in service, thorough independent investigations, not perfunctory probes, must follow, with swift compensation and institutional accountability.

Yes, it is time for the government to modernise the NYSC! But modernisation without confronting the hard truth risks purely cosmetic change. A glossy certificate in digital marketing or automated agriculture is entirely useless if the recipient does not survive the year to collect it.

If these reforms deliver safer and more productive services, they will mark a historic turning point. The corps members and their anxious families deserve a promise that outlasts the press release.

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## While America celebrated 250 years, Iran buried a revolution's guardian

On July 4, 2026 fireworks illuminated the skies over New York as the United States celebrated 250 years of nationhood. The spectacle projected confidence, continuity and national pride. Twenty-four hours later, on July 5, a different kind of display unfolded in Tehran.

Instead of fireworks, there were funeral prayers. Instead of patriotic songs, there were Qur'anic recitations. Instead of celebrating the birth of a republic, millions gathered to mourn the man who, for nearly four decades, defined the direction of another one.

The contrast was striking. One nation celebrated the endurance of a constitutional republic. Another mourned the guardian of an Islamic revolution.

As the funeral procession for Ayatollah Ali Khamenei moves from Tehran through Qom, Najaf, Karbala and finally to Mashhad, where he will be laid to rest on July 9, 2026, the ceremonies have become far more than acts of mourning. They are a carefully choreographed demonstration of continuity, legitimacy, and state power.

The world is not simply watching the burial of a leader. It is watching the endurance of the political system he spent nearly four decades building. When Khamenei succeeded Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini in 1989, many doubted whether he possessed the authority or charisma to preserve the Islamic Republic. Yet, history has shown that charisma was never his principal instrument. His strength lay in institution-building.

If Khomeini founded the Islamic Republic, Khamenei ensured its survival. He transformed Iran from a revolutionary state into a resilient political order where religious authority, military power, intelligence institutions, and ideological legitimacy became deeply intertwined. Under his leadership, the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps evolved into the backbone of the state, while Iran expanded its regional influence despite wars, sanctions, diplomatic isolation, cyberattacks, and repeated internal unrest.

Few leaders have governed under such sustained pressure. Fewer still have left behind a system that appears prepared to function without them. That may ultimately become Khamenei's greatest legacy.

The funeral itself reflects this philosophy of continuity. Every stop along the procession carries symbolism. Tehran represents political authority. Qom embodies religious scholarship. Najaf and Karbala connect Iran's revolutionary identity to the wider Shi'a world. Mashhad, his birthplace and final resting place, completes a journey that binds personal biography to national ideology.

Even the reception of foreign delegations

has conveyed calculated political messaging. We have seen that delegations were welcomed with carefully selected Qur'anic verses tailored to their political and diplomatic contexts, turning religious ritual into an instrument of statecraft. Whether directed at Saudi Arabia, Türkiye, Iraq, Lebanon, or Palestinian movements, the symbolism was unmistakable. Iran was speaking through scripture as much as through diplomacy.

More revealing was the diplomatic attendance itself. More than 70 countries sent representatives to pay their respects. Saudi Arabia's decision to dispatch Deputy Foreign Minister Waleed Al-Khuraiji was especially significant. In international relations, funeral diplomacy is never merely ceremonial. Attendance signals recognition. Presence communicates legitimacy. Riyadh's participation reflected a geopolitical reality that many in Washington underestimated. States ultimately recognise durability.

The government that survived military confrontation, economic pressure, international sanctions, and decades of predictions about its imminent collapse remains the government regional powers must now engage. This is the quiet lesson emerging from Tehran. Power that survives acquires

legitimacy, even among rivals.

History will continue to debate Ali Khamenei. Supporters will remember him as the defender of Iran's sovereignty and the architect of the Axis of Resistance. Critics will remember him as the builder of an uncompromising authoritarian state that restricted political freedoms while projecting influence abroad.

Both interpretations will endure. Yet beyond ideology lies a more enduring political reality. Leaders die, institutions either collapse with them or outlive them.

As America marked 250 years of constitutional continuity beneath fireworks, Iran responded with its own message of endurance, expressed not through celebration, but through ritual, symbolism, diplomacy, and millions marching behind a coffin.

On July 9, Ali Khamenei will finally be laid to rest in Mashhad. Whether one admired him or opposed him, his burial will close the life of a man. It will not, however, close the chapter of the system he built. For now, the man is gone, the machine remains in Mojtaba.

## The antidote of giving: A strategic intervention for national healing

When political or ethnic interests supersede the sanctity of life, farming communities are left defenseless and displaced. These tragedies represent the bitter outcome of a nation that has compromised its moral integrity for the accumulation of power and silence.

True transformation necessitates more than just policy reform; it requires a fundamental change of heart. Christian giving is not merely an act of charity; it is a strategic act of resistance against the culture of greed that fuels widespread insecurity. Generosity serves as a tangible expression of faith and a vital step towards restoring human equality.

By fostering a culture of sacrificial giving and moral integrity, it becomes possible to dismantle the systemic greed that has long hindered national progress. The fight against

corruption must begin with a commitment to value the welfare of one's neighbour as highly as one's own.

Righteousness must be made manifest through action. To transition from theory to practice, a strategic empowerment initiative is being launched within the recently affected communities of Plateau and Southern Kaduna. This effort seeks to provide immediate, tangible relief to mitigate the impact of these tragedies and demonstrate that the antidote to greed is sacrificial service.

Every citizen is encouraged to contribute to this movement, whether through advocacy, resources, or support. Giving functions as a powerful remedy to greed, and through collective action, a practical pathway for national healing is established.

## Kebbi HISBAH treated 4,058 cases of immorality, drug abuse – Commissioner

Operatives of the Kebbi HISBAH Board have registered and treated 4,058 cumulative cases of immorality and other social vices since the inception of incumbent administration in the state from 2023 to date.

He added that since the passage of the bill by the state House of Assembly, and assented to by the executive governor, upgrading it to a board, Kebbi HISBAH, has performed remarkably well in carrying out its mandate of cleansing the society.

## Report of 17m Nigerians facing acute hunger amounts to humanitarian crisis – ADC

The African Democratic Congress (ADC) Tuesday described reports that more than 17 million Nigerians, including infants and young children, are facing acute hunger as a growing humanitarian disaster caused by principally spates of banditry and terrorism that has displaced farming communities, as well as the harsh economic policies.

The party made the statement in Abuja following a United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) report showing that more than 17 million Nigerians across nine conflict-affected northern states are facing acute hunger.

In a statement signed by its national publicity secretary, Mallam Bolaji Abdullahi, the party knocked the ruling All Progressives Congress (APC) for what it described as its “cruel indifference” to the growing humanitarian crisis.

It reads: “The African Democratic Congress (ADC) has received with profound concern the latest assessment by the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP), which confirms that Nigeria is now facing one of its worst food security emergencies in almost a decade.

WFP said more than 17 million Nigerians across nine conflict-affected northern states are now facing crisis, emergency, or catastrophic levels of food insecurity. This represents an increase of almost two million people from previous projections. In Borno state alone, more than three million people are acutely food insecure, while the combined figure for Borno, Adamawa, and Yobe has risen to 6.2 million people.

The party, while lamenting, further described the figures as findings of the world’s leading humanitarian agency on hunger and not opposition figures or campaign slogans.

## Lagos flooding natural, not caused by coastal highway – Sanwo-Olu

Lagos state governor, Babajide Sanwo-Olu, has pledged a joint engineering intervention with the federal government to ease water flow along the Lagos-Calabar Coastal Highway corridor.

The governor stated this Monday evening, while receiving the Minister of Works, David Umahi, and members of the National Assembly Committees on Works who paid him a courtesy visit at Lagos House, Marina, after inspection of the coastal highway

to ascertain the reports in the social media that the construction of the road is responsible for flooding along that axis.

Addressing the minister and his entourage, Sanwo-Olu said the coastal road is not responsible for flooding. He said flooding in Lagos is a natural occurrence linked to the state’s coastal terrain and not caused by the ongoing road project.

He added that Lagos occupies less than 0.26 percent of Nigeria’s total landmass, with one-third of that already taken up by creeks, lagoons and water.

“In this little tiny 0.26 per

cent, everybody is shifting to have a space, to have a means of livelihood. That is the context and reality of Lagos. So, there is a lot of pressure on it,” he said.

He noted that as a coastal city, seasonal flooding should be expected.

“When people say there is flood, without mixing words, it will flood again next year. We just pray it is not too much. It’s like living on the southern coast of America and saying God forbids we won’t see a hurricane. These are natural occurrences,” he said.

The governor blamed poor social

media narratives for exaggerating the problem.

“That’s when they take pictures. They don’t take pictures 24 hours later when it has receded. But that is not to take away the fact that when we have problems we are meant to face it and solve it,” he added.

Sanwo-Olu thanked President Bola Tinubu for the coastal highway, saying Lagos has been the first major beneficiary.

“Two years ago they felt it was just political talk. Today human beings are riding on it. We cannot but thank Mr. President,” he said.

## CNG urges FG to ensure equity on approved federal roads

The federal government has been advised to take a second look at the alleged exclusion of the North-west region from the recently approved road projects worth N3.9 trillion.

The Coalition of Northern Groups (CNG), in a statement signed by the national coordinator, Comrade Jamilu Aliyu Charanchi, said it should not just be dismissed as an administrative oversight.

“The Coalition of Northern Groups (CNG) expresses disappointment over the approval by the FEC of 27 federal road projects worth over ₦3.9 trillion across 15 states while deliberately excluding all seven states of the North-West—Kaduna, Kano, Katsina, Jigawa, Kebbi, Sokoto and Zamfara.

“This omission should not be seen as an administrative oversight considering the region’s political investment in the emergence of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu in the 2023 presidential election.

“The North-west stood firmly behind President Tinubu when it

delivered millions of votes, mobilised its political structures and defended the APC across difficult political terrain.

“More painful is the fact that the North-west is home to some of the country’s busiest and most economically strategic federal highways. From the Kano-Katsina-Maradi corridor to the Sokoto-Gusau-Funtua axis, from the Kaduna-Birnin

Gwari corridor to numerous roads linking many towns and cities, these routes serve agriculture, trade, industry and national security,” he said.

He argued that despite repeated assurances by the government, commuters continue to face security challenges, accidents, traffic delays and economic losses on these roads.

CNG said the development

appeared inconsistent with the federal government’s commitment to equity, inclusion and balanced national development.

The statement reads further: “No government should preside over the complete exclusion of an entire geopolitical zone comprising seven states from a strategic national infrastructure intervention of this magnitude.”

## Kebbi: Police arrest 4 over kidnap threat, N30m ransom demand

The Kebbi state Police command has arrested four suspects for criminal conspiracy, criminal intimidation through anonymous communication, and alleged threat to kidnap a resident after demanding ransom of ₦30 million.

Those arrested are; Muhammad Shafiu, 21, Mansur Ibrahim, 21, Aliyu Umar, 25 and Muhammad Suleiman, 23.

This was contained in a statement

by the Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), SP Bashir Usman, in Birnin Kebbi.

“The suspects were arrested following a complaint by Alhaji Aminu Garba of Jega, who reported receiving threatening phone calls with a demand of ₦30,000,000 or face kidnap.

“Investigation revealed that the 1st, 2nd and 3rd suspects procured a new SIM card and repeatedly called the victim, with one of them disguising his voice to sound like a Fulani man in an attempt to instill fear and conceal his

identity.

“Investigations further established that the 4th suspect, a family friend of the victim, supplied the victim’s phone number and family details, which were used to facilitate the threats.

“Through swift intelligence-led investigation, operatives of the command tracked and arrested the suspects at Gumbin Kure and Gamjeji villages in Maiyama local government area, thereby thwarting the plot before it could be carried out,” the statement reads.

# Zamfara workers cry foul over N7m auction of N100m printing equipment

Staff of the Zamfara State Publishing Company, publishers of The Legacy and Suda newspapers, Tuesday, raised the alarm over what they described as the secretive auction of the company's entire printing equipment.

They said the move has grounded operations and thrown the fate of more than 150 workers into uncertainty.

The workers, who spoke to Blueprint on condition of anonymity, alleged that the management sold off the equipment without following due process.

The workers said the machines were procured in 2008 during the administration of former Governor Mahmud Aliyu Shinkafi at a cost of over N100 million to support the printing of the two state owned newspapers.

"The equipment was bought for over N100 million by the Shinkafi administration to enable the company print The Legacy and Suda newspapers here in Gusau.

"To our surprise, the current management auctioned all of it for just N7 million," one of the staff also said.

He added that the sale has effectively shut down the printing press, leaving the company unable to produce its newspapers.

With operations halted, the workers said they have been left in

limbo.

"The company has over 150 staff and right now, nobody knows our fate because of the stoppage,"

another staff member said.

They workers expressed frustration that the decision was taken without consultation with

staff or relevant stakeholders, and without transparency on how the auction was conducted and who the buyers were.

The workers are appealing to Zamfara state governor, Dauda Lawal, to step in and save the company from collapse.

## Police arrest suspected cultists, recover hard drugs in Akwa Ibom

The police in Akwa Ibom state have arrested three suspected members of the Vikings Confraternity and recovered hard drugs during a raid on an alleged cult hideout in Uyo.

The command also announced the arrest of a security guard accused of vandalising and stealing armoured electrical cables from a church and other facilities in a separate intelligence-led operation.

The police spokesperson in the state, Timfon John, stated this in a statement Tuesday.

The police said operatives acting on intelligence stormed a residential building off Abak Road, Uyo, believed to be a hideout for cult activities and illicit drug abuse.

The suspects were identified as Dick Udofia, Emem Charles, and Ubong Matthew.

"During the operation, officers recovered substances suspected to be Ice (methamphetamine), cannabis, commonly known as Indian hemp, and other items linked to drug consumption," Ms John, a deputy superintendent of police, said.

The police said the three suspects admitted to being members of the Vikings Confraternity.

The police said one of the suspects, Mr Matthew, was forcibly initiated into the cult group on 5 July during a ceremony allegedly masterminded by Mr Udofia at the same location.

The suspects are students of a polytechnic whose identities were withheld, while efforts are ongoing to arrest other fleeing members of the group.

Court jails 10 persons for naira mutilation in Delta, Edo

Others are: Enadegeh Agbonmware and Lucky Osaro.

He said the convicts were said to have tampered with the naira by spraying the same while dancing at a party, an offence contrary to Section 21(3) of the Central Bank of Nigeria Act 2007.

AMAC begins waste evacuation in Kagini community

ACF dismisses fake online meeting of state chairmen

The Arewa Consultative Forum (ACF) has described as false and unconstitutional, reports of a purported online meeting of its state chairmen and secretaries.

It insisted that the organisation's leadership remains intact and operating strictly in line with its constitution.

In a statement issued by its national publicity secretary, Professor Tukur Muhammad-Baba, the forum said its National Executive Committee (NEC) and National Working Committee (NWC) remain the legitimate organs managing the affairs of the organisation.

The ACF said both bodies had continued to function unhindered while supporting ongoing efforts by northern elders to resolve what it described as "extra-constitutional aberrations" in the management of the forum.

The statement said the purported online meeting and the decisions emanating from it were "false, fabricated, mischievous and obviously concocted by shadowy elements who do not wish well of Arewa or the ACF."

The forum added that its constitution recognises only five operational organs- the Patrons, General Assembly, Board of Trustees, National Executive Committee and National Working Committee-and

does not provide for any independent platform of state chairmen and secretaries.

It noted that under its constitution, "state chapter chairmen and secretaries are members of the NEC and cannot validly convene or take decisions outside that structure."

The ACF added that at its June 19 meeting in Kaduna, the National Working Committee reaffirmed confidence in Mr. Mamman Mike Osuman (SAN) and Mallam Murtala Aliyu as chairman and secretary-general of both the NEC and NWC.

It added that the meeting also resolved to refer any member found undermining the forum's constitution to its Code of

Conduct and Ethics Committee for investigation and possible sanctions.

The forum further stated that several state chapters had since dissociated themselves from the purported online meeting and denied participating in it.

It also questioned the advertorial published in three national newspapers, noting that it was allegedly sponsored by an estate management firm with no known affiliation to the ACF.

On reports that a committee had been inaugurated to manage the forum's endowment fund, the ACF stated that only the NEC has the constitutional authority to constitute such committees.

ICPC arrests El Rufai's doctor over abuse of privilege

The Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences Commission (ICPC) has arrested El Rufai's personal physician, Professor Bello Abubakar, over abuse of privilege, and violation of court order.

A press statement by the commission's head, Media and Public Communications, John Odey, Tuesday in Abuja, said: "At this moment, El Rufai's

personal physician, Professor Bello Abubakar, has been taken into custody for further investigation.

The statement noted that: "The ICPC has expressed concern over developments surrounding a court-approved medical visit granted to former governor of Kaduna state, Mallam Nasir El-Rufai, who is currently in the Commission's custody.

"The Kaduna state High Court had fixed July 6, 7, and 8, 2026, for an accelerated hearing of the criminal charges pending against

the defendant. On the first day of hearing, however, Mallam El-Rufai did not appear before the court.

"During proceedings, the prosecution informed the court that when officers of the commission prepared to convey the defendant to court, he declined to accompany them, insisting that he wished to consult his personal doctor.

"The prosecution further informed the court that no prior request had been made to the Commission for such

medical consultation and that, when asked by the Commission's medical doctor, the defendant reportedly indicated that he had no immediate medical complaints but stated that his wife, Asia El-Rufai, who is also one of his legal counsel, had requested that he see his personal physician, Professor Bello Abubakar.

# Ebonyi accuses PDP of bid to set Wike against Nwifuru

The Ebonyi state government Tuesday slammed the opposition Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) over what it described as desperate attempts to create a rift between Governor Francis Nwifuru and the Minister of the Federal Capital Territory (FCT), Nyesom Wike, insisting that both leaders enjoy cordial relationship and mutual respect.

The government accused the two factions of the PDP of twisting Governor Nwifuru's remarks during the June 15, 2026 endorsement rally for President Bola Tinubu and other APC candidates held at the Pa Ngele Oruta Township Stadium, Abakaliki, in a bid to score cheap political points ahead of the 2027 general elections.

Commissioner for Information and State Orientation, Chief Ikeuwa Omebeh, who stated this in a statement issued in Abakaliki, said reports suggesting that Governor Nwifuru threatened Wike during

the rally were false, misleading and politically motivated.

He said at no time did the governor issue any threat against the FCT minister, adding that the governor only warned opposition elements allegedly spreading fake news and propaganda in the name of Wike to desist from heating up the polity in the state.

"The attention of the Ebonyi state government has been drawn to press statements by the national leadership of the two factions of the Peoples Democratic Party, as well as reports in some sections of the media concerning remarks made by His Excellency, Rt. Hon. Francis Nwifuru, during the endorsement rally held on June 15, 2026, at Pa Ngele Oruta Township Stadium, Abakaliki," Omebeh stated.

He said the controversial word "consume" used by the governor during the rally was purely metaphorical and meant that individuals engaging in acts capable of causing a crisis in the state would face the full weight of the law if they failed to retrace their steps.

"The governor only cautioned some opposition elements who are fanning the embers of the crisis in the state and spreading fake news and propaganda in the name of Nyesom Wike to desist from such acts. The word 'consume' was a metaphorical expression indicating that those involved in such acts would face the law," the commissioner said.

Omebeh stated that Governor Nwifuru and Wike share mutual respect and political understanding, insisting that attempts by the PDP and "paid media hirelings" to manufacture bad blood between the two leaders would fail.

He further described the PDP in Ebonyi state as a party battling for survival, arguing that the opposition lacked the moral standing to criticise the performance of the Nwifuru administration while being engulfed in unresolved internal crises.

"A party that has been unable to resolve its internal crisis for years and it lacks the moral rectitude to comment on governance issues," Omebeh said.

*Preying on NCAA funds unhealthy for aviation safety – Achimugu*

The Nigeria Civil Aviation Authority (NCAA), the regulator of the Nigerian aviation industry, has said the consequences of preying on its revenue, saying the action would cripple its operations and jeopardise aviation safety.

The Director of Public Affairs and Consumer Protection at the NCAA, Mr Michael Achimugu, stated this in a chat with journalists in Abuja.

Achimugu was reacting to a recent following attempts to reduce the NCAA's share of the Ticket Sales Charge (TSC) in favour of the Nigerian Airspace Management Agency (NAMA), even though NAMA, by law, should be a self-sustaining agency.

He said the Bill is already under consideration at the National Assembly.

He warned that such a move, if actualised, could further weaken the Authority's financial position and render it unable to meet its regulatory oversight, adding that safety would be compromised and all travellers, regardless of status, would be at grave risk.

Recall that by law, the NCAA collects 5 percent TSC and remits to NAMA, NiMet, NCAT and NSIB based on what the law prescribes.

Experts say countries where air navigation service providers (ANSPs) like NAMA are commercialised or privatised are not funded by the government.

Thus, the concept for the creation of NAMA ab-initio was that it should be self-funded and not dependent on govt treasury. The NCAA, as a safety regulator, was to be funded by the government. However, the 5 percent TSC was introduced to absolve the government of that responsibility. Yet, from this major funding window of the Authority, the government still ceded a significant portion to other aviation agencies to aid their revenues.

"The CAA even requires more money, first of all, let's not forget that the federal government makes deductions from what even comes to the CAA in the first place. Any way you look at it, this move by a revenue-generating agency to cut even more into the CAA's cost recovery is a very unnecessary move, ... The reason planes are not falling from the sky today under this administration, unlike in the past, is because of the CAA" the Director explained.

"The staff of the regulatory agency must be better trained than the service providers they regulate. If inspectors do not possess superior technical knowledge, they cannot effectively enforce safety standards," he said.

He credited the NCAA's regulatory oversight for Nigeria's strong performance in international aviation safety and security audits, as well as improvements in passenger rights protection.

Achimugu called on stakeholders to carefully consider the implications of reducing the NCAA's financial capacity, saying aviation regulators across the world are adequately funded because of the critical role they play in safeguarding lives.

# Nigeria's current account surplus hits \$5.0bn in Q1 2026

The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN)'s Balance of Payments (BoP) show that Nigeria recorded a current account (CA) surplus of \$5.0 billion in the first quarter of 2026, significantly higher than \$1.4 billion in the fourth quarter of 2025 and \$3.4bn in the first quarter of 2025.

The improved surplus on the CA was primarily driven by a sharp increase in the trade surplus, which advanced to \$6.0 billion from \$1.8 billion in

the prior quarter. The stronger trade balance reflected an improvement in export earnings alongside a moderation in import demand.

Merchandise exports increased by 16 per cent quarter-on-quarter (QoQ) to \$15.5 billion, primarily driven by stronger crude oil export earnings.

Crude oil export receipts increased to \$8.1 billion in Q1 2026 from \$6.8 billion in the fourth quarter of 2025, supported by elevated global oil prices.

Export proceeds benefited from a higher geopolitical risk premium arising from heightened tensions in the

Middle East, which supported Bonny Light crude prices.

Additional support came from higher gas exports and refined petroleum product exports, which increased to \$2.5 billion and \$2.4 billion, respectively, from \$2.2 billion and \$2.0 billion in the previous quarter.

The Dangote Refinery's expanding operational capacity has not only reduced Nigeria's reliance on imported refined petroleum products but has also enhanced the country's emergence as a key regional supplier of refined petroleum products.

Turning to imports, total imports declined to \$9.5 billion from \$11.6 billion in the fourth quarter of 2025. The moderation was driven by lower imports of both non-oil goods and oil-and-gas-related products, which fell by 10 per cent QoQ and 40 per cent QoQ to \$7.9 billion and \$1.7 billion, respectively.

The CA also benefited from a strong surplus of US\$5.6bn on the secondary income account. However, this was lower than the \$6.2 billion surplus posted in the fourth quarter of 2025.

According to Proshare, the moderation was driven by a slight decline in remittance inflows and other current transfers, which eased to \$5.3 billion from \$5.7 billion in the prior quarter.

Conversely, the services and primary income accounts remained in deficit, posting shortfalls of \$3.7 billion and \$2.8 billion, respectively.

"Looking ahead, we expect Nigeria's current account surplus to improve further in the second quarter of 2026, supported by favourable developments on both the export and import fronts.

"On the export side, higher crude oil production and sustained elevation in global oil prices are expected to boost export receipts and support the trade balance.

"On the import front, the continued ramp-up of Dangote Refinery's operations should further reduce reliance on imported petroleum products, lower the fuel import bill, and widen the trade surplus.

"That said, Nigeria's structurally import-dependent economy is likely to sustain demand for intermediate goods, machinery, and capital equipment, which could moderate the pace of import compression", said Proshare.

The Debt Management Office (DMO) has opened subscriptions for the July 2026 Federal Government of Nigeria (FGN) Savings Bond, offering investors returns of up to 15.716 per cent per annum, the highest interest rate under the retail bond programme this year.

The subscription window, which commenced on July 6, will close on July 10, while settlement is scheduled for July 15, 2026.

The offer, announced by the DMO on behalf of the Federal Government pursuant to the DMO (Establishment) Act 2003 and the Local Loans (Registered Stock and

Securities) Act, is aimed at encouraging savings, deepening financial inclusion and providing Nigerians with access to low-risk, government-backed investment opportunities.

For the July issuance, the DMO is offering a two-year FGN Savings Bond due July 15, 2028, at 14.716 per cent per annum, and a three-year bond due July 15, 2029, at 15.716 per cent per annum.

The new rates represent an increase of about 94 basis points over the June 2026 offer, when the two-year bond carried a yield of 13.777 per cent, while the three-year instrument offered 14.777 per cent.

The savings bonds are priced at N1,000 per unit, with a minimum subscription of N5,000 and a maximum investment of

N50 million.

Investors will receive interest payments quarterly on October 15, January 15, April 15 and July 15, while the principal will be repaid in full at maturity.

The DMO said the bonds are backed by the full faith and credit of the Federal Government of Nigeria and charged upon the general assets of the federation, making them among the safest domestic investment instruments available to retail investors.

The instruments also enjoy tax exemptions under the Companies Income Tax Act (CITA) and the Personal Income Tax Act (PITA) for eligible investors, particularly pension funds.

The DMO urged interested investors to subscribe through stockbroking firms

appointed as distribution agents under the savings bond programme.

Financial market analyst, Okugbe Abiodun, say the significant increase in coupon rates reflects prevailing conditions in Nigeria's fixed-income market, where yields have continued to rise amid tight monetary conditions.

Okugbe said the DMO appears to be repositioning the FGN Savings Bond to remain attractive to retail investors as Treasury Bills and Open Market Operation (OMO) instruments continue to offer higher yields.

Market analysts also believe the higher yields provide an opportunity for investors to lock in attractive returns over the medium term, particularly if interest rates moderate in the coming years.

However, Mrs. Kudirat Hasna observed that the upward adjustment underscores the Federal Government's higher domestic borrowing costs, a consequence of the sustained high-interest-rate environment driven by the monetary authorities' efforts to curb inflation and stabilise financial markets.

She added that despite the increased cost of borrowing, the FGN Savings Bond remains an important instrument for broadening retail participation in government securities while promoting a savings culture among Nigerians.

With returns now above 15 per cent on the three-year tenor, analysts expect strong demand during the five-day subscription period, especially from retail investors seeking secure investments that outperform conventional savings and fixed deposit accounts.

# Stock market sustains growth trajectory, gains N1.864trn

Transactions on the floor of Nigerian Exchange sustained a growth profile appreciating by N1.864 trillion as gains in highly capitalised stocks lifted trading activities.

Market capitalisation of listed equities appreciated by 1.24 per cent to N152.135 trillion from N150.271 trillion recorded the previous day.

The NGX All Share Index also increased by 2905.05 basis points to 237083.28 points from 234178.23 points traded on Monday.

The positive performance recorded during the day was supported by gains in the shares of Aradel Plc, MTN Nigeria, Dangote Cement, FirstHoldco, Wapco and

48 others.

The Market breath was positive with 53 gainers against 17 decliners, bringing year to date return to 51.96 per cent.

An analysis of the investment showed that Zichis Plc and Cadbury Nigeria Plc led gainers table, appreciating by 10 per cent each to close at N26.62 and N61.60 per unit respectively. Nachco followed with a gain of 9.99 per cent to close at N147.00, Daar Communications added 9.94 per cent to close at N1.99 per share. Caverton Business Solutions gained 9.90 per cent to close at N5.55 per share.

On the contrary, CMFC, TransExpress and FTG Insurance topped losers chart, dropping 10 per cent each to close at N3.33, N2.70 and N2.61 per unit respectively. Ecobank trailed with a loss of 9.98 per cent to close at N85.70 per share, Mecure

dipped by 9.96 per cent to close at N85.45 per share.

Further analysis showed that Volume of trades declined by 44.966 million, representing 8.35 per cent as investors traded 493.672 million shares against 538.638 million traded yesterday. Value of shares traded went down by 27.59 per cent to settle at N28.022 billion in 49969 deals.

Transactions in the shares of Zenith Bank Plc led market activities with 92.296 million shares valued at N9.700 billion. Fidelity Bank followed with account of 29.379 million shares cost N529.357 million. Sterling Bank traded 28.586 million shares worth N218.062 million. Linkage Assurance exchanged 18.833 million shares valued at N284.987 million while JaizBank traded 15.301 million shares valued at N123.641 million.

## Chevron, NGIC sign Network Entry Agreement for Escravos gas delivery

Chevron Nigeria Limited (CNL), in collaboration with Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited's subsidiary - NNPC Gas Infrastructure Company Limited (NGIC), has concluded a Network Entry Agreement (NEA) for the system entry point into the Escravos-Lagos Pipeline System.

Agreement provides a contractual framework to govern safe, efficient gas delivery from the NNPC/CNL JV to NGIC's pipeline network in compliance with the Nigerian Gas Transportation Network Code.

The NEA establishes the contractual framework required under the Nigerian Gas Transportation Network Code to govern gas delivery operations and associated interfacing/information exchange between CNL's Escravos Gas Plant and NGIC.

Jim Swartz, Chairman and Managing Director, CNL, said that the agreement underscores the NNPC/CNL Joint Venture's commitment to safe and reliable gas delivery while supporting Nigeria's broader gas development.

"By strengthening the interface between CNL's Escravos Gas Plant and NGIC's transportation network, we are helping to enhance energy security, infrastructure efficiency and long-term value creation for Nigeria," he said.

Olusoga Oduselu, Chief Corporate Affairs Officer, CNL, stated that the development of Nigeria's uniform NEA framework places Nigeria among the league of countries whose central gas pipeline transporters operate under a standardized framework governing gas injection and offtake.

"By establishing this common gas injection and offtake framework, the NEA reinforces the critical gatekeeping role of the gas Network Operator, NGIC, and delivery facility operators — like CNL, as operator of the NNPC/CNL Joint Venture— in ensuring that incoming gas does not compromise the safety, integrity, or efficiency of the national gas network," he noted.

Oseni, said NERC has transferred electricity market oversight to 16 states, ushering in a new era of multi-level regulation.

"The objective is to ensure that My Lords are familiar with the intricacies and technical nature of the power sector. We look forward to engaging with you and sharing deeper insights into an industry that is critical to Nigeria's economic development," he added.

In a significant boost to infrastructure and development initiatives, the Minister of the Federal Ministry of Innovation, Science and Technology (FMIST), Kingsley Tochukwu Udech SAN, has reaffirmed the Federal Government's commitment to technology commercialisation, local content development, industrial competitiveness, and sustainable job creation.

The minister stated this during a visit to the site of the proposed Project NOVA Hub at the headquarters of the National Office for Technology Acquisition and Promotion (NOTAP).

The visit marks a milestone in the implementation of Project NOVA (Nigeria Outsourcing and Value Acceleration), a flagship initiative envisioned by the Director-General and Chief Executive Officer of NOTAP, Dr. Obiageli Amadiobi, to strengthen Nigeria's science, technology and innovation ecosystem and accelerate the transformation of research, technology, and indigenous innovation into measurable economic value.

The project is expected to deliver modern facilities and economic opportunities, and is being positioned as a flagship endeavour that will enhance service delivery and create thousands of jobs upon completion.

Speaking on Tuesday in Abuja, the Minister described the initiative as a 'new dawn' for the sector. "Today, we are not just laying a foundation of concrete and steel, we are laying the foundation for progress, innovation, and a better future for our people."

He disclosed that more of the hubs will be established across the nation.

Earlier, during her welcome speech, Dr. Amadiobi highlighted that Project NOVA was conceived as a strategic national intervention to address one of Nigeria's most persistent development challenges: the gap between knowledge creation and economic utilisation.

She noted that while Nigeria continues to produce thousands of research outputs, innovations, and highly skilled professionals annually across multiple sectors of the economy, only a fraction is translated into commercial products, services, enterprises, jobs, and industrial growth.

According to her, Project NOVA is designed to serve as NOTAP's national commercialisation and delivery platform, creating structured pathways for technology transfer, innovation adoption, enterprise development, workforce competitiveness, and industrial transformation.

Project NOVA, the DG said, is structured around three integrated pillars namely: NOVA of Excellence (CoE), NOVA Catalyst, and NOVA Impact, which together provide a coordinated framework for research commercialisation, intellectual property management, technology transfer, skills acceleration, enterprise competitiveness, and industry collaboration.

Barely 100 days after assuming office as Commissioner of Police in Lagos State Command, CP Tijani Olaiwola Fatai has introduced a proactive policing strategy that is reshaping security in Nigeria's commercial capital.

Instead of relying mainly on reactive law enforcement, the command has prioritised intelligence gathering, crime prevention, surveillance, community partnership and inter-agency collaboration to identify and neutralise threats before they materialise.

The approach has produced notable results. Within three months, police dismantled cult groups and "One Chance" robbery syndicates, intercepted illegal military camouflage, recovered firearms and ammunition, rescued victims of human trafficking, prevented vandalism of public infrastructure and countered fake security alerts capable of causing panic.

Security experts describe the achievements as evidence of a gradual shift towards intelligence-led policing, where preventing crime takes precedence over responding after offences have been committed.

Lagos, with a population exceeding 20 million people, remains one of Africa's busiest commercial centres. The daily movement of millions of commuters through highways, seaports, airports, markets and industrial hubs presents enormous security challenges. Experts insist that policing such a megacity requires intelligence, technology, surveillance and community participation rather than conventional patrols alone.

## Breaking criminal networks

One of the command's biggest breakthroughs was the interception of an unregistered MAN diesel truck conveying 47 sacks containing military camouflage uniforms alongside 80 cartons of suspected illicit substances.

In the process, four suspects were arrested while investigations commenced to determine the source and intended recipients of the exhibits.

Security analysts consider the recovery strategically important because criminals increasingly disguise themselves as military personnel to establish illegal checkpoints, deceive victims and carry out kidnappings, robberies and other violent crimes.

By intercepting the consignment before it reached criminal hands, police believe several future crimes were prevented.

## Fight against human trafficking

The command also recorded a significant breakthrough against human trafficking after rescuing 12 underage girls from a prostitution syndicate operating around Idumota on Lagos Island.

The operation followed the rescue of a teenage girl found abandoned and bleeding by a

# How intelligence-driven policing is confronting criminalities in Lagos

good samaritan before she was taken to Denton Police Station.

The victim reportedly told investigators that she was lured from Delta state with promises of employment but was instead forced into prostitution. She alleged that she was subjected to repeated abuse and denied her freedom before she escaped with serious injuries.

Acting on the information she supplied, detectives raided the location and rescued 12 additional victims believed to be under the control of the same trafficking syndicate.

CP Fatai disclosed that investigations indicated the syndicate controlled about 30 girls, while efforts are continuing to rescue others and prosecute all those involved.

The operation underscored the command's determination to tackle organised crime, human trafficking and child exploitation.

## Crushing cultism and armed robbery

Cult-related violence remains a major security challenge across parts of Lagos.

To confront that menace, the police carried out intelligence-led operations across Egbeda, Ojo, Ebute Metta, Igando and Ijaiye/Ojokoro, leading to the arrest of suspected members of the Eiye and Aiye Confraternities.

Recovered exhibits included locally-made pistols, ammunition, machetes and other dangerous weapons allegedly used during violent attacks.

In Ajangbadi, four suspected cultists and alleged hitmen

were arrested after investigators reportedly recovered incriminating videos linked to violent killings within the community.

Security experts believe the arrests disrupted organised criminal networks and prevented further attacks.

The command also intensified operations against notorious 'One Chance' robbery syndicates operating across the state.

Using intelligence gathered through surveillance and community information, operatives dismantled several robbery gangs, recovering 51 mobile phones believed to have been stolen from victims.

Additional robbery suspects arrested in Ipaja were found with firearms and motorcycles allegedly used during criminal operations.

For many commuters, the operations reinforced confidence that security agencies are actively confronting one of Lagos' most feared criminal enterprises.

## Illegal firearms, infrastructure and public safety

Removing illegal firearms from circulation has remained another major priority.

Through targeted raids and intelligence-led operations, police recovered 14 firearms and several rounds of live ammunition.

Security experts note that every illegal firearm removed from circulation reduces the risk of armed robbery, kidnapping, cult violence and other crimes.

The command also prevented vandalism of critical public

infrastructure by arresting suspects allegedly stealing electrical cables on the Third Mainland Bridge.

Beyond financial losses to government, such vandalism threatens public safety and essential services.

Police also intensified operations against criminals impersonating military personnel.

In the process, several suspects were arrested for unlawfully wearing Nigerian Army and Nigerian Navy uniforms, including a dismissed soldier allegedly posing as a serving officer.

According to investigators, such impersonation enables criminals to intimidate residents, evade suspicion and gain access to restricted areas.

## Combating misinformation

The command demonstrated professionalism during the Mushin explosion by immediately deploying specialists from its Explosive Ordnance Disposal and Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear Unit.

Investigations established that the explosion resulted from mechanical failure rather than terrorism, helping to calm public fears and prevent unnecessary panic.

Police also confronted the growing threat of fake security alerts circulating on social media.

False reports alleging bandit invasions in Ibeju-Lekki, Imota and other communities were investigated and found to be entirely fabricated.

One fake alert contributed

to the lynching of an innocent commercial motorcyclist after he was wrongly accused of being a criminal. Police subsequently arrested 15 suspects linked to the mob action.

The command also debunked a viral video claiming armed Fulani men had recently been arrested in Ikorodu, explaining that the footage was several years old and deliberately recycled to create fear.

Security experts warn that misinformation has become a serious security challenge because false information can spread faster than verified intelligence.

## Strengthening operational capacity

Operational success has been supported by improved logistics and institutional backing.

The renovated operational base of the Violent Crime Response Unit was commissioned with support from the Lagos state government through the Lagos State Security Trust Fund.

Additional patrol vehicles, bulletproof vests, helmets, operational boots and raincoats have also enhanced officers' mobility and response capability.

Beyond equipment, CP Fatai has strengthened collaboration with traditional rulers, educational institutions, the Police Community Relations Committee and other stakeholders.

Regular security meetings involving Area Commanders, Divisional Police Officers and Tactical Commanders have also reinforced intelligence gathering, professionalism and

operational readiness.

## Experts endorse the strategy

President of the Association of Industrial Security and Safety Operators of Nigeria (AISSON), Dr. Ona Ekhomu, believes intelligence has become the foundation of effective policing.

According to him, modern policing is no longer about responding after crimes occur but preventing them through intelligence, surveillance and collaboration.

Former Force Public Relations Officer, retired CP Emmanuel Ojukwu, said public trust remains central to operational success.

He argued that transparency, timely communication and effective crisis management encourage citizens to volunteer information that strengthens intelligence gathering.

He also described the handling of the Mushin explosion and fake security alerts as examples of professional policing in the digital era.

Constitutional lawyer and Senior Advocate of Nigeria, Monday Ubani (SAN), commended intelligence-led policing but stressed that every operation must comply with constitutional provisions, human rights standards and due process.

According to him, accountability and professionalism remain indispensable to sustainable security.

## A New Policing Template

The operational direction of the Lagos State Police Command also received a boost during the official visit of the Coordinating Deputy Inspector-General of Police for the South-West, DIG Adegoke M. Fayoadé.

The DIG met with officials of the Lagos state government, the Lagos State Security Trust Fund, traditional rulers and officers of the command, commending CP Fatai and his personnel for their professionalism and commitment to intelligence-driven policing.

For many security observers, the command's first 100 days demonstrate that effective policing is no longer measured solely by arrests but by the ability to anticipate threats, dismantle criminal networks before they strike and build public confidence.

From intercepting military camouflage and recovering firearms to dismantling cult groups, rescuing trafficking victims, protecting public infrastructure and combating misinformation, the Lagos State Police Command has embraced a preventive policing model anchored on intelligence, professionalism and accountability.

If sustained through continuous investment in technology, intelligence, logistics and personnel welfare, analysts believe the Lagos model could serve as a blueprint for modern policing across Nigeria.

FIFA backs referee after Trump criticism

FIFA defended the World Cup referee at the centre of the Folarin Balogun controversy after the official was branded "very suspect" by US President Donald Trump.

In a statement, Fifa said Brazilian official Rapahel Claus had "demonstrated the highest standards of professionalism and integrity" throughout his career.

Claus had shown US striker Balogun a controversial red card last week, prompting Trump to lobby Fifa to review the forward's one-match suspension.

Fifa subsequently reprieved Balogun, allowing him to play in Monday's last-16 clash against Belgium in Seattle, in a decision that has been widely criticised.

Trump had questioned Claus's refereeing credentials while speaking to reporters in



the White House earlier on Monday.

"This referee, who is a little bit suspect if you check his past. I don't want to say that because I don't like to create controversy, but very suspect. He made a call that nobody could believe," Trump said.

The remarks had already been condemned by the Brazilian Football Confederation (CBF), who said there was nothing in Claus's background that "gives grounds for suspicion."

Fifa chief refereeing officer and chairman of the referees committee Pierluigi Collina, said Claus was a key member of the World Cup referees pool.

"Raphael Claus is refereeing at his second Fifa World Cup, having been with us in Qatar in 2022," Collina said in a statement.

"He is an experienced and highly respected referee and we maintain full confidence in him as a trusted match official."

Zimbabwean footballer Divine Lunga has survived a gun attack in Johannesburg, South African police have said.

The football star, 31, was driving in the inner city suburb of Hillbrow on Sunday when his car was shot at by an unknown gunman, according to local reports.

Lunga, who plays for both Zimbabwe's national football team and top South African club Mamelodi Sundowns, escaped unharmed.

Crime is a major problem in South Africa and the country has one of the highest murder rates in the world.

Police spokesperson Captain Tintswalo Sibeko said they were investigating a case of attempted murder but that no arrests had been made.

She did not provide further details, but South African publication The Citizen said that Lunga was on his way

to church with his younger brother when they came under attack.

The duo were driving through Hillbrow when the suspect opened fire on their car, apparently mistaking him for an undercover police officer.

Lunga has played 21 times for Zimbabwe's national team and was part of the team's squad for the Fifa World Cup 2026 qualifiers.

The defender joined

Mamelodi Sundowns in 2021 and has helped them win four domestic league titles, as well as their second African Champions League in May.

Neither team has commented on the shooting but the Warriors, as Zimbabwe's national team is known, has posted a picture of Lunga in a prayer position with a short caption, reading "In God we trust" alongside his name.

Gauff completes Slam semifinal set with Wimbledon fightback

Coco Gauff produced another gritty comeback to defeat fellow American Jessica Pegula at Wimbledon on Tuesday and become the youngest player to reach the semifinals of all four Grand Slams since Maria Sharapova.

The 22-year-old, playing in her first Wimbledon quarterfinal, dug deep to fight back from a set down for a second straight match and beat Pegula 4-6, 6-3, 6-3 on Centre Court.

"Just trusting my shots, I think I made a bit too many errors in the first set, rushing the rallies a little bit," said Gauff, after winning a fourth consecutive three-set tie at the All England Club this fortnight.

"I've been going three sets nearly every match, so I think when you have that faith as a competitor, you don't panic when you go a set down."

The two-time Grand Slam champion will face either Naomi



Osaka or Karolina Muchova on Thursday in her first major semifinal since winning last year's French Open.

Sharapova was 20 years old when she completed the set of Grand Slam semifinal appearances at the 2007

French Open.

Gauff has previously struggled to find her best form on grass, despite knocking out Venus Williams en route to the last 16 on her major debut at Wimbledon in 2019 when aged 15.

Serena wants to play again before US Open – Coach

Serena Williams wants to play singles tournaments before the US Open, unlike her preparation for Wimbledon, the American legend's coach Rennae Stubbs said on Tuesday.

Williams, 44, played two doubles matches in preparation for her comeback to singles tennis at the All England Club, but lost in the first round last week.

The 23-time Grand Slam champion then had to withdraw from the doubles with sister Venus due to a knee injury suffered in the defeat by Australian Maya Joint.

"I'll leave it to her to discuss her medical stuff and how she's feeling but I know that for her trying to play, certainly something before the US Open will be something she would like to do," Stubbs told reporters at Wimbledon.

"She doesn't want to go and do what she did here, which was just play singles, at the US Open, but at the same time it's going to depend on



physically how she's doing."

There are WTA 1000 events in Toronto and Cincinnati ahead of the US Open, which starts on 30 August.

Serena, who returned after almost four years away from professional tennis, has not confirmed her next steps.

"She's got a lot of things to

consider, her family, her businesses. But her goal is to keep going," insisted Stubbs, who expected her to find life easier on hard courts, the surface on which Williams has won 13 major singles titles.

"Getting on the hard court will be a lot more stable for her. And we all know how well she plays on hard court," Stubbs said.

## RCA stages charity half marathon, targets infant mortality

Organisers said the event would bring together elite runners, recreational athletes, fitness enthusiasts and corporate teams, all united by a common goal of supporting improved healthcare delivery.

President of Run Club Abuja, Buchi Onyegbule, said the complete sale of available race slots demonstrates the confidence participants and partners have continued to place in the initiative.

## World Cup: Argentina produce late magic to stun Egypt

Lionel Messi inspired Argentina to a remarkable World Cup comeback as they came from two goals down to beat Egypt 3-2 in a dramatic last-16 game on Tuesday.

The holders were 11 minutes from a shock defeat trailing 2-0, but goals from Cristian Romero, Messi and the Enzo Fernandez two minutes into stoppage time from Enzo Fernandez kept them in the competition.

Egypt had been on the brink of one of the great World Cup upsets after goals from Yasser Ibrahim and Mostafa Zico. Messi had squandered an early penalty.

The Africans fell apart in the closing stages, however, as Argentina's captain inspired his side in a dramatic turnaround.

Just when it seemed that extra time was on the cards, Enzo Fernández headed into the net in the second minute

It is the first time in World Cup history that a team has won a knockout match in

Argentina, who are bidding to become the first back-to-back World

Cup champions since Brazil in 1958 and '62, will face winner of Colombia or Switzerland in the quarterfinals in Kansas City on Saturday.

## WAFU B U-20 Championship: Musa motivates F/Eagles with cash gift

Former Super Eagles captain, Ahmed Musa has gifted the sum of two million naira to players of Nigeria's U-20 national team, Flying Eagles, as the team intensifies preparation for the WAFU B U-20 Championship taking place in Cote d'Ivoire, 26th July – 9th August.

Musa, Nigeria's most-capped international player with 111

caps, who scored four goals in two appearances at the FIFA World Cup finals in 2014 and 2018, presented the cash gift to the two-time FIFA World Cup silver-medallists through the team's coordinator, Alhaji Abubakar Abubakar.

The former Nigeria captain also charged the players to be focused ahead of the forthcoming

tournament, where the WAFU B zone's representatives to next year's Africa U20 Cup of Nations will emerge.
